

ABOUT THE COMPETITION:

In celebration of the 75th Anniversary and the long-standing relationship between the U. S. Coast Guard and Elizabeth City, an art contest is being held for students from any Elementary, Middle and High School within Pasquotank County-Elizabeth City school system. Artwork will be divided into the three educational levels with awards presented at each level.

The artwork must represent aspects of the U.S. Coast Guard such as aircraft, cutter, people or missions. Artwork will be displayed at the Museum of the Albemarle and the first place winners in each level will have their artwork prominently displayed at the U.S. Coast Guard Base Command Building on permanent exhibition.

AWARDS:

Elementary School Level (K-5)

1st Place- \$100 + permanent display
2nd Place-\$75
3rd Place- \$50

Middle School Level (grades 6-8)

1st Place- \$200 + permanent display
2nd Place-\$100
3rd Place- \$75

High School Level (grades 9-12)

1st Place- \$300 + permanent display
2nd Place-\$200
3rd Place- \$100

JUDGES:

Artwork will be judged by a panel of artists, sculptors and Coast Guard members. Each entry will be judged on capturing the essence of the U.S. Coast Guard, creativity and artist ability. In addition, the public will have an opportunity to cast votes during the viewing period at the Museum of the Albemarle.

The Museum of the Albemarle reserves the right not to display artwork deemed not in the best interest of the Museum. MOA will not be responsible for loss or any damaged caused.

ENTRY:

There is no entry fee. All students must submit one piece of original artwork (entirely the work of the single artist), two dimensional work such as paintings, watercolor, or drawing (no smaller than 8 X 10, no larger than 18 X 24), or three dimensional artwork such as ceramics are also accepted. All work must be dry and ready for display.

All artwork must have a label tag (included on registration form) attached to the back of the work. In addition, a brief explanation of the artwork and its relationship to the theme "Coast Guard in Elizabeth City" (150-200 words) should be included.

All three 1st place winners will have their artwork on permanent exhibition in the U.S. Coast Guard Base Command Building.
