## Cutter History:

The 110-foot, wooden hulled United States Coast Guard tug *Leopard* was acquired from the U.S. Shipping Board in 1926 at New York, New York. She was originally built in 1920. She detached from the New York Coast Guard District and was assigned to the Coast Guard Depot at Curtis Bay, Maryland. She was transferred to New York, New York in 1933.

She was sold on 18 May 1935.
