Subj: PRECEPT CONVENING A SELECTION BOARD TO CONSIDER CHIEF WARRANT OFFICERS FOR APPOINTMENT AS TEMPORARY COMMISSIONED OFFICERS IN THE GRADE OF LIEUTENANT

(b) Officer Accessions, Evaluations, and Promotions, COMDTINST M1000.3(series)

1. Pursuant to the authority provided by references (a) and (b), a Selection Board is appointed consisting of yourself as President and the following members:

LCDR Lawrence F. Ahlin, USCG - Member

LT Thomas C. Mansour, USCG - Non-voting Recorder

2. The Board shall convene at 0800, 8 September 2014, in suite 501, Coast Guard Personnel Service Center, or as soon thereafter as practicable, for the purpose of considering all eligible chief warrant officers who have applied for appointment as temporary commissioned officers in the grade of lieutenant. Members of the Board shall swear or affirm that they will, without prejudice or partiality, and having in view both the special fitness of officers and the efficiency of the Coast Guard, perform the duties imposed upon them, and that they will not disclose their proceedings to any person not a member of the Board.

3. The Board shall recommend the best-qualified applicants for each occupational field in numbers not greater than those indicated below (to be listed as primary candidates). Alternate candidates may be designated when the number of applicants exceeds the number of authorized selections and those candidates are found fully-qualified. Both the primary and alternate candidates shall be listed in order of selection. When the number of applicants is less than or equal to the maximum number of authorized selections, the Board may recommend those candidates who are found fully-qualified. If there are an insufficient number of applicants for any occupational field, the Board may select fewer than the maximum authorized. For occupational fields where the number of applicants is less than or equal to the maximum authorized, if the Board finds any candidate not fully-qualified for appointment, the reasons therefore shall be set forth in detail in the board report.

4. The Board is authorized to recommend the best-qualified candidates in the numbers and occupational fields listed below:

5. Applicants applying for more than one occupational field may be recommended as a primary candidate in only one field. Once an applicant has been recommended as a primary candidate they may not be recommended as an alternate in another field. However, applicants applying for more than one occupational field not recommended as a primary candidate in any field may be recommended as an alternate in more than one field.

6. The Board shall refer to the provisions of Sections 3.A and 6.A of reference (b) and the enclosed Commandant's Guidance to PY15 Officer Selection Boards and Panels in your development of criteria for determining the officers recommended for selection. Additionally, section 6.A.3 of reference (b) provides four factors to consider in developing your criteria: performance, professionalism, leadership, and education.

7. You should emphasize to the members of the Board the importance of their obligation to confine themselves to facts of record and not predicate judgments on rumor or hearsay. At the end of your deliberations, all members must be able to say that the officers recommended for appointment to temporary lieutenant are, in the opinion of at least a majority of the members if the board has five members, or in the opinion of at least two-thirds of the members if the board has more than five members, the best-qualified to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the grade for which they are selected.

8. The Board shall submit a report in writing signed by all members of the Board. Except for the report of this Board, the proceedings of the Board shall not be disclosed to any person not a member of the Board. You will direct the members of the Board that their recommendations shall be kept confidential until the Secretary approves the report on behalf of the President, and the names of officers selected for promotion are released to the Service at large.
