Master Chief Petty Officer Jason K. Wong assumed duties as Command Master Chief for Personnel Services Center (PSC) on June 15, 2015. As the senior enlisted advisor, Master Chief Wong provides advice on workforce policies, is the senior enlisted mentor, and acts as a sounding board for all administrative functions of PSC which impacts the entire Coast Guard workforce from recruitment to retirement.

At the time of his selection, Master Chief Wong served as the Command Master Chief for Sector St. Petersburg, FL. Originally from Honolulu, Hawaii, Master Chief Wong enlisted in the United States Coast Guard in 1993. His previous assignments include Battalion Commander, Training Center Cape May, NJ; Health Services Center, Training Center Cape May NJ; CGC Vigilant, FL; ISC Portsmouth, VA; CGC Point

Evans, HI; and ISC Honolulu, HI.
