

Subj: AMENDMENT TO THE PRECEPT CONVENING A RETENTION BOARD TO
RECOMMEND CAPTAINS OF THE COAST GUARD ON THE INACTIVE DUTY
PROMOTION LIST FOR CONTINUATION IN AN ACTIVE STATUS

(b) Section 741, Title 14, U. S. Code

1. Per reference (a), prior to the date the Board submits its report, I am authorized to add or delete the name of any officer to the Inactive Duty Promotion List for any reason. The six officers named below promoted to Captain on 01 July 2009. In accordance with reference (b), the Board shall consider all of the Reserve Captains on the Inactive Duty Promotion List for continuation in an active status, with the exceptions noted in Paragraph 2 of reference (a).

Paragraph 3 of reference (a) is hereby modified to read: There is hereby established a retention zone of 44 captains on the Inactive Duty Promotion List consisting of the most senior officer in the grade of captain, namely, Captain Stephen E. Ohms, USCGR, and those 43 officers junior thereto, through and including Captain Donald W. Jillson, USCGR. The names and records of all officers to be considered for retention shall be furnished to the Board. The 39 best qualified officers shall be recommended for retention.

Subj: PRECEPT CONVENING A RETENTION BOARD TO RECOMMEND CAPTAINS OF
THE COAST GUARD ON THE INACTIVE DUTY PROMOTION LIST FOR
CONTINUATION IN AN ACTIVE STATUS

Ref: (a) Section 741, Title 14, U.S. Code
(b) CG Personnel Manual, COMDTINST M1000.6A

1. Pursuant to the authority provided by references (a) and (b), a Retention Board is appointed consisting of yourself as President and the following members:

RADM Jan T. Riker, USCGR – Member
RADM John C. Acton, USCGR - Member
RADM Ronald J. Rábago, USCG - Member
RDML Steven E. Day, USCGR - Member

CDR James M. Kelly, USCGR - Non-voting Recorder

2. The Board shall convene at 0830, 06 July 2009, in suite 501, Coast Guard Personnel Service Center, or as soon thereafter as practicable, for the purpose of considering all eligible officers in the grade of captain for retention in an active status. All Coast Guard Reserve Captains who are on the Inactive Duty Promotion List, who have 18 years or more of service for retirement, who will not complete 30 years of total commissioned service by 30 June 2010, and who will not reach 59 years of age by 06 July 2009 are eligible for retention. Members of the Board shall swear or affirm that they will, without prejudice or partiality and having in view both the special fitness of officers and the efficiency of the Coast Guard, perform the duties imposed upon them, and that they will not disclose their proceedings to any person not a member of the Board.

3. There is hereby established a retention zone of 38 captains on the Inactive Duty Promotion List consisting of the most senior officer in the grade of captain, namely, Captain Stephen E. Ohms, USCGR, and those 37 officers junior thereto, through and including Captain Ronald J. Kraemer, USCGR. The names and records of all officers to be considered for retention shall be furnished to the Board. The 34 best qualified officers shall be recommended for retention.

4. Prior to the date the Board submits its report, the Commander, Coast Guard Personnel Service Center, is authorized to add or delete the name of any officer from the Inactive Duty Promotion List for any reason. In the event any officer in the retention zone established herein is added to or removed prior to the date the Board submits its report, the Commander, Coast Guard Personnel Service Center will provide additional instructions. Any communications to the Board by any officer under consideration will be transmitted under separate cover.

5. The Board shall refer to the provisions of Sections 5.A and 14.A of reference (b) and the enclosed Commandant's Guidance to PY10 Officer Selection Boards and Panels in your development of criteria for determining the officers recommended for retention. Additionally, section 14.A.3 of reference (b) provides four factors to consider in developing your criteria: performance, professionalism, leadership, and education.

6. You should emphasize to the members of the Board the importance of their obligation to confine themselves to facts of record and not predicate judgments on rumor or hearsay. At the end of your deliberations, all members must be able to say that the officers recommended for retention are, in the opinion of at least a majority of the members if the board has five members, or in the opinion of at least two-thirds of the members if the board has more than five members, the best qualified to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the grade for which they are retained.

7. The Board shall submit a report in writing signed by all members of the Board. Except for the report of this Board, the proceedings of the Board shall not be disclosed to any person not a member of the Board. You will direct the members of the Board that their recommendation shall be kept confidential until the Commandant approves the report, and names of the officers selected for retention are released to the Service at large.
