The United States Coast Guard Band celebrates Labor Day in dramatic and patriotic style. Band alumni join the current roster of musicians in a celebratory concert that also honors the career of soon-to-be retired Master Chief Musician Cheryl Six.

Musician 1st Class Lisa Williamson sings the rousing *Battle Hymn of the Republic*, followed by Lee Greenwood's classic *God Bless the USA*. Alumnus and clarinetist Thomas Labadorf presents the virtuosic *Carnival of Venice* and two previous conductors of the Band, former Assistant Director James Dygert and Conductor Laureate Lewis J. Buckley, lead the ensemble. The second half of the program features trombone soloist MUI Benjamin Griffin in the Dixie medley *A Musical Journey through New Orleans* and Tchaikovsky's vivid *1812 Overture* concludes the festivities.

MUCM Cheryl Six, piccolo, retires after thirty years of distinguished service. Over the course of her notable career, MUCM Six has received numerous honors for her efforts in managing the Band's extensive music library and developing work-life initiatives, and for her exceptional local and international volunteer work. MUCM Six is especially noted for over 1,000 remarkable concert performances of the difficult piccolo solo part in John Philip Sousa's *Stars and Stripes Forever*.

Megan and Chief Warrant Officer Richard E. Wyman.
