Featured Musicians

Chief Musician Adam B. Crowe, principal tuba, is a native of Guin, Alabama. He began his musical training at the age of 11 and later attended the University of Alabama where he studied with J. Michael Dunn, former tubist with the U.S. Marine Band and Alabama Symphony Orchestra. MUC Crowe was a finalist in the Arnold Jacobs Mock Orchestral Competition and in the Tuba Quartet Competition at the 1998 International Tuba Euphonium Conference. He was also a winner of the 1998 and 1999 Alabama Federation of Music Clubs Solo Competitions. While in Connecticut, he has enjoyed performing with the Connecticut Virtuosi and Avant Brass Quintet. Adam also serves as conductor for the Classic Brass Band of Willimantic, a British-style brass band consisting of the area's finest amateur musicians, educators, and students. In 2007 he hosted the Northeast Tuba and Euphonium Conference (NERTEC). MUC Crowe has been a member of the Coast Guard Band since 1999.

Musician 1st Class Thomas H. Brown, trumpet, is a native of Sparta, Michigan. A member of the Chicago Civic Orchestra in 2001 and 2002, he graduated from the University of Michigan in 1998 with a Bachelor of Music degree in trumpet performance and received a Master of Music degree from Indiana University in 2001. He has studied with Charles Daval, John Rommel, Arnold Jacobs, and Adolph Herseth. MU1 Brown joined the United States Coast Guard Band in 2002.

Chief Musician Gino Villarreal, trumpet, is a native of Rio Grande City, Texas. He received a Bachelor of Music degree from Baylor University. Prior to joining the Coast Guard Band in 2005, he served

in the U.S. Military Academy Band at West Point, New York. MUC Villarreal has been a member of the Storm King Brass, The Imperial Brass, the Newburg Symphony, and the Waco Symphony. He has also performed with many different ensembles including The Jazz Knights, the Symphony of South East Texas, the Dallas Wind Symphony, the Richardson Symphony, the East Texas Symphony, and has been a featured soloist with the U. S. Military Academy Band and The Imperial Brass Band. His teachers include Raul Sosa Ornelas, Barry Hopper, Tom Booth, Wiff Rudd, Larry Black, and Robert Sullivan.

Chief Musician Adam R. Williamson, conductor, received a bachelor's degree from the Crane School of Music of the State University of New York at Potsdam in 2001 where he studied saxophone with Timothy McAllister. He currently studies conducting with Glen Adsit and conducts the Noank Mystic Community Band. MUC Williamson joined the Coast Guard Band in 2003 as the tenor saxophonist.

Musician 1st Class Lisa Williamson, soprano, is the vocal soloist with the United States Coast Guard Band. She has represented the Coast Guard in over 175 performances including at the 2006 and 2007 Indianapolis 500 races. MU1 Williamson holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the Peabody Conservatory of Music and is pursuing a Performer's Certificate at the University of Connecticut. Her teachers include Dr. Constance Rock, Dr. Stanley Cornett, Patricia Schuman, and Tricia Lepofsky. MU1 Williamson's husband can be found in the saxophone section and on the podium during this evening's concert. She has sung for the Coast Guard since 2005.
