Guest Artists

Dr. Mallory Thompson, conductor, is director of bands, professor of music, and coordinator of the conducting program at Northwestern University. In 2003 she was named a Charles Deering McCormick Professor of Teaching Excellence. As the third person in the University's history to hold the director of bands position, she conducts the Symphonic Wind Ensemble, teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting, and administers all aspects of the band program. Prior to this appointment, Thompson held similar positions at the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, University of South Florida, Oberlin Conservatory, and Bucknell University. She has released recordings with the University of Cincinnati Wind Symphony and the Northwestern University Symphonic Wind Ensemble.

Thompson received a bachelor of music education degree and master of music degree in conducting from Northwestern University, where she studied conducting with John P. Paynter and trumpet with Vincent Cichowicz. She received a doctor of musical arts degree in conducting from the Eastman School of Music, where she studied with Donald Hunsberger. Mallory Thompson was recently named Artistic Director of the Northshore Concert Band after serving as Principal Guest Conductor since 1998. Thompson maintains an active schedule as guest conductor, clinician, and guest lecturer throughout the United States and Canada. She has appeared as a conductor or clinician at College Band Directors National Association regional and national conventions, the Midwest

Clinic, the Interlochen Arts Academy, and the Aspen Music Festival, and she has conducted the United States Army Band, the United States Air Force Band, the Dallas Wind Symphony, and the Symphony Silicon Valley. Her professional affiliations include Pi Kappa Lambda, the Music Educators National Conference, the College Band Directors National Association, and the American Bandmasters Association.

Bethany Croxton, horn, is currently a senior at Fitch Senior High School, and has played the French horn for eight years. She has participated in the Eastern Connecticut Youth Symphony Orchestra, the Thames Valley Youth Orchestra, the Thames Valley Wind Ensemble, the Eastern Connecticut Regional Band, and the Connecticut All-State Band. She has also attended Hart School of Music's summer French horn camp and Penn State's summer music festival. Bethany has studied with Aimee Page and currently studies with Jaime Thorne. She is also involved in vocal music, singing in Fitch's chamber and women's choirs as well as her church's teen choir. Next year Bethany plans to attend the University of Massachusetts at Amherst as a music education major.
