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
Complaints Corner

On Appeal, EEOC Increased the Monetary Amount Awarded by an AJ for damages associated with pain and suffering in the case of *Regist v. Department of Veterans Affairs*, EEOC Appeal No. 0120093445. In this case, the complainant was a Chaplain trainee who alleged that he was constantly harassed by the Chief of the Chaplain Service. The Chief was alleged to have made the complainant work in poor office conditions and prevented him from getting endorsements from the Episcopal Church, a requirement to be a Chaplain for Veterans Affairs. The complainant charged the Chief of the Chaplain Service with harassment, caused him public humiliation, sleeplessness, damage to his reputation and health problems. He was awarded \$12,000 in compensatory damages by the AJ but during the appeal, EEOC substantially increased the award to \$75,000 due to the length of time the complainant suffered from harassment. He also serves as a member of the Pacific Area Leadership and Diversity Council. Dr. Gibbons (bottom), is a civilian and a member of the Coast Guard Auxiliary who spent 90 days deployed with the Federal Emergency Management Agency disaster recovery team in the aftermath of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita at the Baton Rouge Joint Field Office, Baton Rouge, La. Alaska Native Students visit CG Headquarters

Seventeen students from Eben Hopson Middle School in Barrow, AK, along with five educators visited CG Headquarters during the school’s first Leadership Washington Student Tour. This trip was an extension of the Coast Guard Alaska Native Education Outreach program initiated last fall which included visits to elementary, middle, and high schools in three Alaskan Native communities. During their visit to CGHQ, the group met ADM Allen, watched a flyover, had a briefing about a CG small boat, and toured the building. Many donned traditional attire when greeted by Admiral (Ret.) Stephen Rochon at the White House. This initiative aligns with Coast Guard’s outreach to Alaskan Native communities and includes educating their youth about CG, thereby developing generational relationships with tribal communities and organizations.
