### Honored: War Hero is MOH Recipient

The first full-blooded Sioux Indian to receive the Medal of Honor is one of the most decorated soldiers in North Dakota history. During the final allied offensive of the Korean War, Master Sergeant Woodrow Wilson Keeble (pictured) risked his life to save his fellow Soldiers. This month, almost six decades after his gallant actions and 26 years after his death, the Medal of Honor was conferred to him in a ceremony at The White House.



### Founding Member of NNOA Dies



Captain Ken Johnson, one of the founding members of the National Naval Officer Association (NNOA), an organization that actively supports recruiting, retaining, and developing the careers of minority officers, died January 7<sup>th</sup> and was buried with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery last month. Captain Johnson helped stand-up NNOA in 1972 while stationed at the U.S. Naval Academy, where his assignment in 1970 as the first minority affairs officer was instrumental in improving minority accessions.
