

## **STEPS TO START COLLEGE**

### 1. Questions to ask yourself:

- ❑ What is your goal? General Education? Associate's degree? Bachelor's Degree?
- ❑ What Major are you interested in? What careers can that major lead you to?
- ❑ What type of college do you want to go to? Online? Campus?

### 2. Research and compare colleges:

- ❑ Do they have the major that you are interested in?
- ❑ What are their Active Duty/Veterans Benefits?
- ❑ What is their accreditation (regional or national)?

### 3. Transcripts

- ❑ Collect all transcripts, Coast Guard and College
- ❑ Submit to college(s) for evaluation

### 4. Register

- ❑ Meet with advisor to discuss what classes you need and quickest way possible to a degree
- ❑ Decide how many classes you feel comfortable starting with

### 5. Tuition

- ❑ Find out how much tuition will be and if there are fees involved
- ❑ Complete Command form and webTA
- ❑ Look into grants to cover any additional fees or book costs

Your ESO is here to help you along the way at any step. Make sure to make an appointment with your ESO frequently to discuss your steps and progress along your educational path.

# Tuition Assistance (TA)

- ▶ TA pays 75% of tuition, up to \$250/credit
  - That totals \$3375 per year.
- ▶ What you don't use, you lose
  - Each October 1<sup>st</sup>, TA “refreshes”: All TA from previous FY is gone, and TA for new FY begins

# Grants

- ▶ **SEG Grant (CGMA)**

- CGMA will reimburse eligible clients up to \$350 per calendar year for documented education costs specifically required by a course of study. For reimbursable items:

- ▶ **Foundation Grant (CGFEG):** the maximum reimbursement per calendar year (CY) is \$500.00 (All active duty E-3 to E-9 and reserve E-3 to E-9 currently serving on active duty orders of at least one year are eligible)

# Grants contd....

- ▶ **Vander Putten (VPEG):** the maximum reimbursement per calendar year (CY) is \$250.00. (All active duty E-3 to E-9 and reserve E-3 to E-9 currently serving on active duty orders of at least one year are eligible)
- ▶ **CG Foundation Spouse Education Grant (SPEG):** The maximum payable is \$500 per calendar year. (Spouses of active duty enlisted personnel in pay grades E-3 to E-9.)

# FAFSA: <https://fafsa.ed.gov/>

- ▶ A *Federal Pell Grant*, unlike a loan, does not have to be repaid. Federal Pell Grants usually are awarded only to undergraduate students who have not earned a bachelor's or a professional degree.
- ▶ Amounts can change yearly. For the 2015–16 award year (July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016), the maximum award is \$5,775. The amount you get, though, will depend on
  - your financial need (income & # of dependents),
  - your cost of attendance,
  - your status as a full-time or part-time student, and
  - Your plans to attend school for a full academic year or less.

# Loans

## ▶ CMGA Loan

- The loan maximum amount increased from \$2,000 to \$3,000
- The restriction was removed that a client must repay any existing Education Loan balance before becoming eligible for an additional Education Loan.
- As an example – if a client received a \$2,000 Education Loan in March of 2014 and has repaid six months at \$100 (\$600), and has a current outstanding loan balance of \$1,400, that client would immediately be eligible for an additional \$1,600 Education Loan, provided he/she is otherwise qualified.
