JAMES C. SANDERS



JAMES C. SANDERS is the Administrator of the U.S. Small Business Administration.

Nominated to this position by President Reagan on February 4, 1982, and confirmed by the United States Senate on March 29, 1982, Jim Sanders pledged to revitalize SBA and to define anew the proper role of the Agency in assisting small business to thrive and grow to the general benefit of our Nation.

Sanders began his career as an insurance broker in 1950 and started up his own company with partner Lou Sullivan a year later. Sanders & Sullivan became one of the top 100 privately owned brokerages in the country, and when, in 1979, it merged with the sixth largest American insurance firm of brokers, Jim Sanders was named Chief Executive Officer and Chairman of the Board of Corroon & Black/Sanders & Sullivan, an international insurance brokerage corporation. Just prior to his nomination as Administrator, Sanders served as Associate Administrator at SBA for Management Assistance.

A native of Kansas City, Missouri, Sanders received a degree in civil engineering at the University of Kansas in 1948 and did his graduate work in economics at Stanford University. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1944 to 1947, and is married to the former Jo Dillon.



Duncan Hunter


As Congressman for California's 45th Congressional District (San Diego), Duncan Hunter has been recognized as a dynamic presence on the national political scene. A former paratrooper and Vietnam Veteran who worked his way through law school at night, Hunter waged a grass-roots campaign in 1980 from his barrio law office, defeating a nine-term Democrat incumbent.

After Hunter's upset victory, he gained a hard-won seat on the prestigious House Armed Services Committee. This assignment benefits not only Hunter's own district, which contains the largest Navy port on the West Coast, but also the entire state of California, which leads the nation in terms of defense dollars spent on procurement.

Hunter serves on the subcommittee on Military Personnel and Compensation and is the only Representative from the West Coast on the important Seapower subcommittee.

As a Freshman representative, Hunter received national attention for his actions on behalf of veterans and national defense. His measure to restore benefits to the widows and children of Vietnam Veterans killed in the line of duty was adopted into law in December, 1982. This measure earned Hunter the gratitude of thousands of military families, as well as recognition by the national media.

An avid outdoorsman, the 35 year old California native and his wife Lynne are the proud parents of two sons, Duncan Duane, 7 and Robert Samuel, 1 year old.



MRS. KATHARINE LARKIN

Mrs. Katharine Larkin is the wife of Vice Admiral Charles E. Larkin, U.S.C.G. Born Katharine Buck in Glastonbury, Connecticut, she attended Connecticut College in New London, Connecticut and received a Bachelor of Science degree in Education from Wheelock College in Boston, Massachusetts. Mrs. Larkin married then Ensign Charles E. Larkin and they are the proud parents of 5 children and have one grandchild. Their children are Charles Larkin, married to Sharon and residing in Tulsa Oklahoma; Michael Larkin, married to Terry and residing in Virginia, they are the parents of 6-month old Erin; Lynn Larkin-Bellin, married to Robert and working on her masters degree in social work; James Larkin, a graduate of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, Class of 1984 and currently an ensign on the Coast Guard Cutter Acushnet; Dale Larkin, a senior at the University of Washington and a member of the Air Force ROTC. The Larkins currently reside in Seattle, Washington.



THELMA DUGGIN

*Coordinator of Minority Affairs
U.S. Department of Transportation*

Thelma Duggin serves as Coordinator of Minority Affairs at the Department of Transportation, where she coordinates the activities of the Departmental Offices of Civil Rights and Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization, including the related activities of other secretarial offices and operating administrations. Ms. Duggin is also responsible for major policy and program matters regarding civil rights, equal employment opportunity, and minority, women-owned, and small and disadvantaged businesses.

Prior to accepting the position at DOT, Ms. Duggin served as Special Assistant to the President, under Secretary of Transportation Elizabeth Dole when she was Assistant to the President for Public Liaison at the White House. Ms. Duggin was Director of the 50 States Project, an effort to identify discriminatory state laws, and coordinated outreach activities to the Black community and youth organizations.

A native of Mobile, Alabama, Ms. Duggin is a former field coordinator for Wright McNeill and Associates which directed the Black Community Involvement Program for the Republican National Committee. She was also a Senior Merchandise Manager for a major retail firm.

Ms. Duggin holds a degree in education from Edgewood College in Madison, Wisconsin, and in 1981 received an Honorary Doctorate from Morris Brown College in Atlanta, Georgia.



VICE ADMIRAL CHARLES E. LARKIN, USCG (Retired)

Vice Admiral Charles E. Larkin, USCG (Retired) was born in Los Angeles and graduated from high school in Seattle. He graduated from the Coast Guard Academy in 1949 and 3 years later earned the coveted wings of a Naval Aviator.

In 1957 he received training as a helicopter pilot. While assigned to Air Station San Francisco he was awarded the Air Medal for a helicopter rescue.

The early sixties saw him continuing his involvement with Coast Guard aviation, going from Barbers Point, Hawaii to Elizabeth City, N.C. and to Naples, Italy where he served as commanding officer. In 1968, then Commander, Larkin became a distinguished graduate of the Air War College at Maxwell Air Force Base. Also during this period he acquired a Master of Science degree from George Washington University.

Following 2 years in Mobile, Alabama and various West Coast assignments, he was selected for promotion to flag rank and pinned on his new stars in July, 1976. The admiral then assumed the responsibilities of Chief, Office of Personnel at Coast Guard Headquarters, where he was awarded his third Meritorious Service Medal. Vice Admiral Larkin left Washington, D.C. in the summer of 1978 for Seattle where he took over as Commander, 13th Coast Guard District. He then served as Superintendent, U.S. Coast Guard Academy until June, 1982, when he was promoted to Vice Admiral and assumed duties as Commander, Pacific Area in San Francisco, where he served until his retirement this past summer.

The Admiral and his wife, the former Katharine Phillips Buck of Glastonbury, Connecticut now reside in Seattle. They have five children.


