General Information: 110-foot Island-class Patrol Boats are a Coast Guard modification of a highly successful British-designed patrol boat. With excellent range and sea-keeping capabilities, the Island Class, all named after U.S. islands. Built in the late 1980s they are equipped with advanced electronics and navigation equipment. They are armed with one 25 mm and two M-2 .50 caliber machine guns.

Missions: These cutters concentrate on law enforcement - mainly drug and illegal alien interdiction duties. They are also involved in port security, search and rescue and defense readiness operations. In all, there are 49 operating within the Coast Guard.
