Established: The Active was launched in Sturgeon Bay, Wis., July 31, 1965, and commissioned Sept. 17, 1966. The present Coast Guard Cutter Active is the seventh cutter by that name since the first cutter Active was commissioned by Alexander Hamilton in 1790. The Active has an endurance of approximately 30 days and a cruising range of 5,000 miles at a speed of 15 knots. Direct pilothouse control of its two 2,500 horsepower engines, together with variable pitch twin screws, allows for great control and maneuverability. The Active has two small boats that are used for boarding vessels as well as search and rescue. The cutter can also accommodate a Coast Guard HH-65A Dolphin, which increases Active's effectiveness as a search and rescue and law enforcement asset.

What we do: The Active's missions include Homeland Security, law enforcement and search and rescue. It patrols the U.S. exclusive economic zone to enforce

federal fisheries and vessel safety laws. Active also enforces laws regarding illegal immigration. Active patrols the Northern Pacific Ocean, from the stormy Alaskan seas to the warm waters off Central America, and west to Hawaii.
