


Airfield Operations

The Elizabeth City Regional Airport is a Joint-Use airport operated by the US Coast Guard and the Elizabeth City-Pasquotank County Airport Authority. The Coast Guard oversees the airfield operation supporting both military and civilian flight operations.

Airfield Driver Licensing Program

The Elizabeth City Regional Airport is a dynamic environment with military and civilian aircraft landing, departing, and taxiing, as well as helicopters operating in dispersed locations around the airfield. The careful and controlled accommodation of these activities is critical to protecting the safety and security of aircraft operations, aircraft passengers, ground vehicles, and personnel on the airfield. Awareness and a thorough understanding of potential risks, appropriate practices, and the airport environment—including the potential risk of accidents and incidents—are paramount to ensuring overall safety.

To help maintain high safety standards, the Airport has instituted mandatory vehicle operator training for all persons operating a vehicle within the Airfield Operations Area. It is the responsibility of each person who operates a ground vehicle in the AOA (includes aircraft parking ramps), to receive local airfield familiarization training and to be familiar with the rules and procedures of the Elizabeth City Regional Airport.

❖ Supervisor Approval Required

Airfield/Ramp vehicle operator applicants must present a signed copy of the form with supervisor's signature or sponsoring agency's approval in order to receive an airfield driver's license. [Application Form](#)

❖ Civilian Driver's License

Applicants must have a valid state issued driver's license, and if applicable, a valid CDL for the class of vehicle or Coast Guard certification.

❖ Testing Requirements

To receive an Airfield Driver's License or Ramp Permit, applicants must attend the Airfield Driver Familiarization Class and successfully pass the written test with a score of 85% or better.

❖ Denial of License

The Airfield Manager reserves the right to deny an applicant's request to operate a vehicle on the airfield where the interests of flight safety are best served by such denial.
