


### **Naval Vessel Protection Zones:**


The U.S. Navy and Coast Guard are enforcing security zones around all U.S. Navy vessels. No vessel may come within 100 yards of a U.S. naval vessel, whether the naval vessel is underway or moored. Additionally, vessel must slow to minimum speed necessary to maintain steerage when coming within 500 yards of any U.S. naval vessel. These zones apply to the ports of Jacksonville, Canaveral, and Fernandina.

The U.S. Coast Guard is also enforcing security zones around all tank vessels, cruise ships, and military pre-positioned ships (MPS) in the ports of Jacksonville and Canaveral. No vessel may come within 100 yards of these ships, whether these ships are underway or moored.




## A: Mayport Basin

The U.S. Navy and Coast Guard are enforcing a restricted area inside the Mayport Basin (Ribault Bay). No vessels are allowed within the Mayport Basin.




## B: Atlantic Marine and Drydock

The U.S. Navy and Coast Guard are enforcing a security zone 50 yards around Atlantic Marine and Drydock. Vessels may not come within 50 yards of the facility.




## C: Blount Island

The U.S. Marine Corps and Coast Guard are enforcing a restricted area at the entrance of Blount Island. No vessels are permitted in the Back River (Gate slipway).



## D: Navy Fuel Depot

The U.S. Navy and Coast Guard are enforcing a restricted area around the Navy Fuel Depot. No vessels are allowed within this area.



**E: NAS  
Jacksonville**

The U.S. Navy and Coast Guard are enforcing a security zone in the St. Johns River around Naval Air Station Jacksonville. No vessels are allowed within this zone.
