Issue: Boom deployed in conjunction with response efforts is being vandalized, destroyed and stolen.

On or about 15 JUN Houma ICP received reports that deployed boom was being vandalized and destroyed Shortly thereafter request was made for regulated navigation area (RNA) around all boom (to restrict mariners to 300 yards away) in the Lafourche Parish (Port Fourchon)

On 15 Jun a Regulated Navigation Area (RNA) combined with a Safety Zone was proposed. The RNA will cover the entire response area; whereas the safety zone will designate specific requirements with regard to activity around the boom to ensure protection of it. This would provide two sources of authority to enforce protection of the boom, both of which are class D felonies for violation of and both of which carry a max penalty of \$40,000.

Contractors state that there is also evidence of people taking boom anchors and boom line marking balls. Multiple incidents in Gulf and Franklin County over the past couple of weeks. This is taking up to much contractor time and resources. I have personally confirmed 03 out of 6 incidents since 8/18. I have seen one cut with knives, one connector beat with a hammer, and one covered in hull paint.</p> <p>PO's (b) (6) and (b) (6) arrived on 8/28 afternoon. They will be ready to roll on 8/27.</p>

Good day Mobile,  
Had some pretty significant boom vandalism done last night (01JUN):

- Tier 1 Boom (G-D1-3) off of St Joseph State Park (29.54'N/085.25'W), Crews discovered 15 anchors (composite anchors, \$2k a piece), 15 anchor balls, and several boom lights (\$400 a piece) missing and lines cut. This is very time consuming and expensive. This area of the park is inaccessible by vehicle and is remote. We believe vessels are coming in at night unopposed and unnoticed.

Crews here out of St Joe are spending a ton of resources repositioning booms throughout Gulf and Franklin County while putting boom in the other counties east of us.

Highly recommend some LE or uniformed presence with on water capabilities. These events are occurring at night.

We have had similar incidents in Gulf County as well. COTP New Orleans set up a 20 meter safety zone yesterday around all oil spill response operations including boom, this should be explored for COTP Mobile:

Gulf County has experienced some significant boom damage as well over the past 2 weeks. I personally confirmed 3 of the incidents. As far as we can tell these incidents occur at night.

- 1 - Tier 1 boom off of Cape San Blas (29.37'N/085.21'W) - Boom was cut with a knife next to connecting mechanism.
- 2 - Tier 1 boom off of Mexico Beach (29.50'N/085.20.5'W) - Boom was ran over by vs1 and slashed by props. Blue hull paint all over it.
- 3- Tier 1 boom at Indian Pass (29.40'N/085.14'W) - Boom connecting pins were beat and broke with a hammer.

These incidents are really taking away resources.....
