Scope

Privilege(s)

The scope of privileges in clinical social work includes evaluation, diagnosis, treatment and consultation for patients with psychological disorders. Social workers apply clinical social work techniques for the purpose of understanding, preventing, and relieving psychological-based distress or dysfunction and to promote subjective well-being and personal development. They determine risk for harm, fitness/suitability for duty, and suitability for special assignments. Providers work with individuals of all ages, couples, families, groups and communities. Clinical social workers provide comprehensive behavioral health services in multiple settings including, clinic, inpatient, family advocacy programs, substance abuse treatment programs, and Service specific programs such as combat stress teams.

- Consult with Medical/Allied Health Agencies
- Personnel assessment and selection (for special programs, i.e., PRP, security clearances, special duty)

- Substance abuse treatment (IAW with DoD and Service policy)
