

## UNITED STATES COAST GUARD CUTTER JARVIS (WHEC-725)

The U. S. Coast Guard Cutter JARVIS is the second of the "hero class" cutters named after distinguished heroes of the Coast Guard. The JARVIS is named after Captain David H. JARVIS. Captain JARVIS devoted the majority of his service career to pioneering and developing maritime activities in the Alaska/ Bearing Sea Area. His most memorable feat was the successful completion of the task of driving a herd of reindeer across the tundra and pack-ice to Point Barrow, preventing the certain death by starvation of the men of a whaling fleet who were iced-in and marooned for the winter, (1897-98).

The keel for JARVIS was laid on 9 Sept 70 and she was launched at Avondale Shipyard on 24 April 1971. She is the eleventh of the new 378-ft. class cutters which represent huge strides forward for the U. S. Coast Guard's ocean-going fleet.

The JARVIS will be home-ported at Honolulu, Hawaii. She carries a crew of 15 officers and 140 enlisted men. She is powered with a combination of diesel and gas-turbine engines which make her one of the most versatile and effective ships of her size afloat, with huge cruising range and high speed capabilities. The JARVIS will be employed in ocean station patrol, search and rescue and oceanographic research missions, in addition to maintaining a significant war readiness as an anti-submarine warfare vessel.



REAR ADMIRAL JOHN D. MC CUBBIN, USCG

Rear Admiral John D. MC CUBBIN graduated from the Coast Guard Academy in 1939. In 1942 he was graduated from the Naval Air Station at Pensacola, Florida. He has served as Commanding Officer of Coast Guard Air Stations at Barbers Point, Hawaii and Kodiak, Alaska and in staff positions as Assistant Chief Operations Division, Western Area; Chief, Operations Division and Chief of Staff, 17th Coast Guard District. In December 1967 he was advanced to the rank of Rear Admiral. Prior to becoming Commander, Eighth Coast Guard District in June 1971, he served as Chief, Office of Reserve, Coast Guard Headquarters.

COMMANDER FREDERICK O. WOOLEY, USCG

Commander Frederick O. WOOLEY, U. S. Coast Guard, graduated from the U. S. Merchant Marine Academy, Kings Point, New York in June, 1942, after which he served in all theatres of World War II as Deck Officer with United States Lines Company. He was Commissioned Ensign U. S. Navy Reserve upon graduation from Kings Point and commanded 3 merchant vessels before being commissioned in the U. S. Coast Guard in 1951. His Coast Guard experience has included tours aboard USCGC MACKINAC and USGCG PONTCHARTRAIN as Operations Officer and USGCG BOUTWELL as Executive Officer, in addition to 11 years in the Marine Inspection field and 3 years as Officer in Charge, USCG Merchant Marine Detail, Bremen, Germany. (Commander WOOLEY is scheduled for promotion to Captain in the very near future).
