Task Organization:

a. NORTHWIND (WAGE-282) CAPT J. A. BRESNAN (1355) USCG 1 WAGE

1. Situation: The annual Bering Sea Patrol will be conducted in the area of the Bering Sea and the Arctic Ocean, commencing on the 15th of June and terminating at the close of the navigational season in the Bering Sea. The Bering Sea Patrol performs medical care, law enforcement, marine inspection, aids-to-navigation, and assistance duties and cooperates with Federal and Territorial agencies within this isolated area.

2. Mission: To perform law enforcement duties coming within the purview of Title 14 USC 89, including assistance to Federal and Territorial Government agencies in law enforcement. To provide medical care, marine inspection, aids-to-navigation and assistance wherever necessary.

3. Execution: This force shall conduct the 1958 Bering Sea Patrol. Operations to be performed in accordance with Annexes "A" thru "F".

- a. Provide logistic services to outlying Coast Guard units, including exchange and small stores items as practicable.
- b. Cruise as far north and east as Point Barrow to acquaint personnel with the area and conditions that may be encountered.

x. Coordinating Instructions:

- (1) This order is effective, for planning purposes upon receipt and for operations, upon reporting to Commander, Seventeenth Coast Guard District 15 June 1958 at Seattle, Washington.
- (2) Arrive Juneau, Alaska prior to 232000Z for an administrative conference with Commander, Seventeenth Coast Guard District and other government agencies.
- (3) Upon completion of the Bering Sea Patrol about 10 October 1958, and when released from operational control by Commander, Seventeenth Coast Guard District, proceed to Seattle, Washington and resume your regular station and duties.

4. Administration and Logistics:

- a. Normal supply will be in accordance with Comptroller Manual 3A02010.
- b. Special logistic support will be provided as appropriate and requested.
- c. A sixteen foot dinghy, an outboard motor, a portable fathometer and a portable X-ray machine will be provided at Juneau, Alaska for use during the patrol.

- d. Submit news information and photographs for publicity to Commander, Seventeenth Coast Guard District during and at the conclusion of the operation
 - e. Upon the conclusion of the Bering Sea Patrol submit a detailed report to the Commandant via Commander, Seventeenth Coast Guard District and Commander, Western Area, covering all phases of the operation.

ANNEX "B"
LAW ENFORCEMENT

1. Purpose: To set forth law enforcement instructions for the Bering Sea Patrol.
2. Objective: To maintain high standards of law enforcement during the patrol.
3. Discussion: The Bering Sea Patrol has been an annual service of the Coast Guard for approximately seventy years. For many years this patrol provided the necessary law enforcement functions which other agencies could not perform. Inasmuch as the Coast Guard is the one single Federal Agency possessing the broad authority and responsibility for enforcing laws on the high seas and in the territorial waters of the U. S., its territories and possessions, it is desired to reaffirm the high priority of law enforcement.
4. Instructions: The law enforcement responsibilities are divided into the following categories:

- a. Enforcement of the criminal code and the civil laws of the U. S.
- b. Enforcement of laws and regulations applicable to the fisheries and wildlife.
- c. Enforcement of regulations at the specific request of other Federal Agencies.

Law enforcement responsibilities falling within the three categories above shall be the responsibility of the Commanding Officer, USCGC NORTHWIND. To assist in carrying out these functions, the Commanding Officer has been appointed as a Commissioner for the Second, Third and Fourth Judicial Divisions, Territory of Alaska, and the Executive Officer has been appointed a Deputy U. S. Marshal for such districts.

MARINE INSPECTION

1. Boarding Program: Conduct a vigorous boarding program utilizing every opportunity to acquaint boat operators with provisions of the Motorboat Act of 25 April 1940.
2. Motorboat Operators:
 - a. Conduct examinations for motorboat operators license, refer to Commandant letter dated 7 July 1954 (MVP-LC-PL4-6/1-3) copy enclosed.
 - b. Commander, 17th Coast Guard District will furnish all necessary forms and instructions for ship's personnel who will administer this program.
3. Certificates of Award of Numbers:

COOPERATION WITH OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

1. Medical and Dental:

- a. Attend a conference at Juneau, Alaska on or about 24 June 1958 at hours to be arranged by Commander, 17th Coast Guard District, with the following interested parties: Commander, 17th Coast Guard District, Commissioner of Health, Alaska Department of Health and Area Medical Director, U. S. Public Health Service, for the purpose of coordinating with these agencies, to best advantage, the medical and dental aid program for the Alaskan natives.
- b. Attend a meeting on or about 26 June 1958 at Sitka, Alaska with the Medical Director, ANHS Hospital, Mt. Edgecumbe, Alaska for the purpose of discussing the various medical and dental problems which may be encountered in the field.
- c. Procure remainder of medical supplies which were not delivered by USPHS Hospital, Seattle, Washington from ANHS Hospital, Mt. Edgecumbe, for this patrol.
- d. Obtain portable X-ray machine from Commander, 17th Coast Guard District for use on patrol. Commander, 17th Coast Guard District will arrange for X-ray technician to instruct ship's personnel in operation and maintenance.
- e. Render medical and dental assistance and other services to the natives in Alaska in cooperation with the Alaska Native Health Service.

2. Judicial: Make a court cruise if directed by Commander, 17th Coast Guard District.



HUNTING REGULATIONS ST. MATHEWS ISLAND

1. As a special privilege and in the interests of the wildlife management program, the Regional Director, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, Juneau, Alaska, has granted permission for the officers and crew of the CGC NORTHWIND to hunt reindeer on the Island of St. Mathew during the season of the 1958 Bering Sea Patrol. The hunting permitted herein shall be limited to St. Mathew Island only, and does not apply to other areas or wildlife in Alaska. The taking of these animals shall be done according to the following conditions:

- (a) Hunters are limited to officers and crew members only who are citizens of the United States.
- (b) No hunting license is required.
- (c) Bag limits shall be controlled by the Commanding Officer of the NORTHWIND and shall be limited to the needs of the vessel.
- (d) Adult reindeer of both sexes may be taken.
- (e) A record shall be made of the number of animals taken and their sex.
- (f) Several jaw bones shall be saved and delivered to the Fish and Wildlife Service, Juneau, for scientific study.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLECTING HYDROGRAPHIC, OCEANOGRAPHIC
AND METEOROLOGICAL DATA

General Statement: The 1958 patrol into the Bering Sea Area provides an excellent opportunity for the gathering of valuable information for scientific and operational use by the United States government and for support of the International Geophysical Year. To provide for a vigorous collection of such data it is desired that these instructions be carefully carried out.

1. Meteorological Program: The meteorological program is intended to utilize the on board equipment which enables NORTHWIND to take upper air observations, upper wind observations, and surface observations. The U. S. Weather Bureau is cooperating in this program by assigning a qualified and responsible observer to direct the program. The Weather Bureau, Seattle office, will assist in preparing NORTHWIND for the meteorological program by technical advice and by supplying the expendables (225 balloons, 200 radiosonde transmitters, and 100 cylinders of helium from Navy Supply Source) for the program. One hundred and fifty Rawin Targets will be provided by Headquarters directly to NORTHWIND. The Weather Bureau observer will report on board NORTHWIND for the patrol on or about 10 June 1958 at Seattle. The scope and details of the program will be as desired by the Weather Bureau specialist and technical control and responsibility for the program will rest with this specialist. It is desired that NORTHWIND in carrying out this program follow the general instructions for the working arrangements aboard Coast Guard ships with Weather Bureau observers as outlined in chapter 4 of COMWESTAREA's SOP-1C. It is especially desired that the ship support of this program by the services of the Coast Guard aerographer mates, the CIC team, and the other ship personnel be as complete as possible. The program will basically consist of two daily rawinsonde and four daily surface weather reports. These weather report messages should be sent priority to Observer, San Francisco, via any Navy or Coast Guard radio station. Additionally there will be a program of sea water and air sample collection. These samples are for use by the Atomic Energy Commission in its analysis of Strontium 90 and Carbon 14 concentration and distribution in the oceans. The Weather Bureau observer will take the required samples.

2. Hydrographic Program: Operations Instruction 22-58, copy attached, contains the Commandant's instructions for carrying out a depth sounding program. It is intended that the Bering Sea Patrol carefully follow this instruction.

3. Bathythermograph Observations:

a. Bathythermograph Observations shall be made as follow:

(1) One lowering every six hours to coincide with the time that a surface weather observation is taken. (0000, 0600, 1200, 1800 GMT).

b. BT observations shall be recorded on Hydrographic Office form "Oceanographic Log Sheet B" (FRNC - MHO - 1189). The weather data shall be obtained from the weather observer on board, using the weather code on the Oceanographic Log Sheet, which differs slightly from the International Weather Code. The person who actually makes the observation shall initial the Oceanographic Log Sheet in the appropriate space. The officer of the deck shall then place his initials beside the observer's initials after he is satisfied that the observation has been correctly made and the proper information recorded. At the conclusion of the patrol the completed slides, accompanying log sheets, and forwarding letter, shall be sent to the Hydrographic Office, Washington 25, D. C., attention: Division of Oceanography. A copy of the forwarding letter shall be sent to the Commandant (OFU).

c. Bathythermograph observations are particularly desired from the shallow water of the Bering Sea. When the water is less than 200 feet deep the observation should be taken with Model OC-1/S Bathythermograph (Shallow B/T). When the water is from 200 to 500 feet deep the observation should be taken with Model OC-2/S Bathythermograph (Medium B/T). At other times the observations should be made with the Model OC-3/S Bathythermograph (Deep B/T).

d. Detailed information and instructions on the use of Bathythermograph are contained in Hydrographic Office publication number 606c.

4. Report: A report covering the above program should be included as an annex to the Bering Sea Patrol Report. In particular the performance of the Delta Rawin Target should be noted and reported. This target has not been extensively used in operations and information on its performance is of interest. Attention is called to the report "Project W-72, Shipboard Evaluation of Rawin Targets," 7 July 1954, from U. S. Coast Guard Electronics Engineering Station, Wildwood, New Jersey, which is being furnished to NORTHWIND. Details concerning the Rawin Target that should be included in this report are:

- a. A tabulation of the slant ranges and altitudes at which the target is lost.
- b. Any unusual weather conditions that may have caused an effect on the results tabulated in part (a).
- c. Launching difficulties if any.
- d. Failures.
- e. Other remarks and/or recommendations for improvement.

1. Situation: The annual Bering Sea Patrol will be conducted in the area of the Bering Sea and the Arctic Ocean, commencing on the 15th of June and terminating at the close of the navigational season in the Bering Sea. LAW ENFORCEMENT

1. Purpose: To set forth law enforcement instructions for the Bering Sea Patrol.
2. Objective: To maintain high standards of law enforcement during the patrol.
3. Discussion: The Bering Sea Patrol has been an annual service of the Coast Guard for approximately seventy years. For many years this patrol provided the necessary law enforcement functions which other agencies could not perform. Inasmuch as the Coast Guard is the one single Federal Agency possessing the broad authority and responsibility for enforcing laws on the high seas and in the territorial waters of the U. S., its territories and possessions, it is desired to reaffirm the high priority of law enforcement.
4. Instructions: The law enforcement responsibilities are divided into the following categories:
 - a. Enforcement of the criminal code and the civil laws of the U. S.
 - b. Enforcement of laws and regulations applicable to the fisheries and wildlife.
 - c. Enforcement of regulations at the specific request of other Federal Agencies.

Law enforcement responsibilities falling within the three categories above shall be the responsibility of the Commanding Officer, USCGC NORTHWIND. To assist in carrying out these functions, the Commanding Officer has been appointed as a Commissioner for the Second, Third and Fourth Judicial Divisions, Territory of Alaska, and the Executive Officer has been appointed a Deputy U. S. Marshal for such districts.

HUNTING REGULATIONS ST. MATHEWS ISLAND

1. As a special privilege and in the interests of the wildlife management program, the Regional Director, Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, Juneau, Alaska, has granted permission for the officers and crew of the CGC NORTHWIND to hunt reindeer on the Island of St. Mathew during the season of the 1958 Bering Sea Patrol. The hunting permitted herein shall be limited to St. Mathew Island only, and does not apply to other areas or wildlife in Alaska. The taking of these animals shall be done according to the following conditions:

- (a) Hunters are limited to officers and crew members only who are citizens of the United States.
- (b) No hunting license is required.
- (c) Bag limits shall be controlled by the Commanding Officer of the NORTHWIND and shall be limited to the needs of the vessel.
- (d) Adult reindeer of both sexes may be taken.
- (e) A record shall be made of the number of animals taken and their sex.
- (f) Several jaw bones shall be saved and delivered to the Fish and Wildlife Service, Juneau, for scientific study.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLECTING HYDROGRAPHIC, OCEANOGRAPHIC
AND METEOROLOGICAL DATA

General Statement: The 1958 patrol into the Bering Sea Area provides an excellent opportunity for the gathering of valuable information for scientific and operational use by the United States government and for support of the International Geophysical Year. To provide for a vigorous collection of such data it is desired that these instructions be carefully carried out.

1. Meteorological Program: The meteorological program is intended to utilize the on board equipment which enables NORTHWIND to take upper air observations, upper wind observations, and surface observations. The U. S. Weather Bureau is cooperating in this program by assigning a qualified and responsible observer to direct the program. The Weather Bureau, Seattle office, will assist in preparing NORTHWIND for the meteorological program by technical advice and by supplying the expendables (225 balloons, 200 radiosonde transmitters, and 100 cylinders of helium from Navy Supply Source) for the program. One hundred and fifty Rawin Targets will be provided by Headquarters directly to NORTHWIND. The Weather Bureau observer will report on board NORTHWIND for the patrol on or about 10 June 1958 at Seattle. The scope and details of the program will be as desired by the Weather Bureau specialist and technical control and responsibility for the program will rest with this specialist. It is desired that NORTHWIND in carrying out this program follow the general instructions for the working arrangements aboard Coast Guard ships with Weather Bureau observers as outlined in chapter 4 of COMWESTAREA's SOP-1C. It is especially desired that the ship support of this program by the services of the Coast Guard aerographer mates, the CIC team, and the other ship personnel be as complete as possible. The program will basically consist of two daily rawinsonde and four daily surface weather reports. These weather report messages should be sent priority to Observer, San Francisco, via any Navy or Coast Guard radio station. Additionally there will be a program of sea water and air sample collection. These samples are for use by the Atomic Energy Commission in its analysis of Strontium 90 and Carbon 14 concentration and distribution in the oceans. The Weather Bureau observer will take the required samples.

2. Hydrographic Program: Operations Instruction 22-58, copy attached, contains the Commandant's instructions for carrying out a depth sounding program. It is intended that the Bering Sea Patrol carefully follow this instruction.

3. Bathythermograph Observations:

a. Bathythermograph Observations shall be made as follow:

(1) One lowering every six hours to coincide with the time that a surface weather observation is taken. (0000, 0600, 1200, 1800 GMT).

b. BT observations shall be recorded on Hydrographic Office form "Oceanographic Log Sheet B" (PRNC - MHO - 1189). The weather data shall be obtained from the weather observer on board, using the weather code on the Oceanographic Log Sheet, which differs slightly from the International Weather Code. The person who actually makes the observation shall initial the Oceanographic Log Sheet in the appropriate space. The officer of the deck shall then place his initials beside the observer's initials after he is satisfied that the observation has been correctly made and the proper information recorded. At the conclusion of the patrol the completed slides, accompanying log sheets, and forwarding letter, shall be sent to the Hydrographic Office, Washington 25, D. C., attention: Division of Oceanography. A copy of the forwarding letter shall be sent to the Commandant (OFU).

c. Bathythermograph observations are particularly desired from the shallow water of the Bering Sea. When the water is less than 200 feet deep the observation should be taken with Model OC-1/S Bathythermograph (Shallow B/T). When the water is from 200 to 500 feet deep the observation should be taken with Model OC-2/S Bathythermograph (Medium B/T). At other times the observations should be made with the Model OC-3/S Bathythermograph (Deep B/T).

d. Detailed information and instructions on the use of Bathythermograph are contained in Hydrographic Office publication number 606c.

4. Report: A report covering the above program should be included as an annex to the Bering Sea Patrol Report. In particular the performance of the Delta Rawin Target should be noted and reported. This target has not been extensively used in operations and information on its performance is of interest. Attention is called to the report "Project W-72, Shipboard Evaluation of Rawin Targets," 7 July 1954, from U. S. Coast Guard Electronics Engineering Station, Wildwood, New Jersey, which is being furnished to NORTHWIND. Details concerning the Rawin Target that should be included in this report are:

- a. A tabulation of the slant ranges and altitudes at which the target is lost.
- b. Any unusual weather conditions that may have caused an effect on the results tabulated in part (a).
- c. Launching difficulties if any.
- d. Failures.
- e. Other remarks and/or recommendations for improvement.





