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# Station Peck's Beach, New Jersey

## Coast Guard Station #127



<b>Location:</b>	Midway Pecks Beach, 2 3/4 miles northeast of Corson Inlet and 6 1/8 miles northeast by north of Ludlam Beach Light; 39-14' 50"N x 74-36' 50"W
<b>Date of Conveyance</b>	1849
<b>Station Built:</b>	1870
<b>Fate:</b>	Discontinued in 1922

### Keepers:

John Stiles was first appointed on NOV 22, 1872 and left the service in 1877.

Leaming Godfrey was appointed on AUG 21, 1879. He resigned due to physical reasons on AUG 9, 1900.

Adolphus C. Townsend was appointed on SEP 26, 1900 and was still serving as of 1915.
