



**Rear Admiral Carlton D. Moore**  
**Deputy Commander Mobilization and Reserve**  
**Component Affairs, Coast Guard Atlantic Area**  
**Deputy Commander Fifth Coast Guard District**



Rear Admiral Carlton D. Moore assumed the duties of Deputy Area Commander Mobilization & Reserve Component Affairs Coast Guard Atlantic Area, Deputy Commander, Fifth Coast Guard District in May of 2000. RADM Moore received his commission in the Coast Guard Reserve in 1969, and spent three years in the Operations Division, Thirteenth Coast Guard District. The balance of the 33 years of service with the Coast Guard has been in assignments with the Coast Guard, Coast Guard Reserve and the Navy. He was mobilized in response to 9/11, providing direct support of the Area Commander, responsible for integrated reserve operations for all traditional Coast Guard missions and surge operations in response to both domestic and foreign contingencies. During this period he also served as the Coast Guard representative to the Joint Military Intelligence College, Defense Intelligence Agency.



Prior assignments included Deputy Area Commander for Mobilization and Reserve Component Affairs, Pacific Area, Deputy Commander, Eleventh Coast Guard District, and Deputy Commander for Expeditionary Warfare, with the Commander, Naval Surface Reserve Forces in New Orleans, Louisiana. Additionally, he served as the Coast Guard Reserve Liaison Officer with Naval Reserve Headquarters, under the program manager in the Coast Guard's Office of Defense Operations.

RADM Moore has had three unit commands and two group commands. Until June of 1997, he was Commanding Officer of Harbor Defense Command Unit 114 in Honolulu, Hawaii, commanding both Coast Guard and Naval reservists involved in rapid deployment of personnel in support of overseas expeditionary operations involving port and harbor security. Prior to that, he was Commanding Officer of the Coast Guard National Strike Force Exercise Support Unit in Salt Lake City, Utah, Commanding Officer, Coast Guard Reserve Unit San Luis Obispo, Commander, Coast Guard Reserve Group Monterey and Commander, Coast Guard Reserve Group Pacific Area.

RADM Moore retired from the Coast Guard Reserve in June of 2002. Subsequent to his retirement, he was recalled to active duty twice for duty in Coast Guard Headquarters. In response to the collision of the Cosco Busan with the San Francisco Bay Bridge in 2007, he headed the Coast Guard's Incident Specific Preparedness Review. In response to the oil spill from the explosion and sinking of the Deepwater Horizon, he was the team leader for that Incident Specific Preparedness Review.

In his civilian position he was an attorney with the State of California, handling matters involving Maritime and International Law. RADM Moore was appointed to the Coast Guard Navigation and Safety Advisory Council by Department of Transportation Secretary Dole, 1986, and served as vice-chair for three years. His community service includes Past President of the Sacramento Chapter of the Navy League, and Vice President, Optimist Club, supporting programs for disadvantaged youths. He lives in California with his wife Cindy. They have two children, Chip and Andrea.
