**Keepers:**

Stratton Schellinger was appointed Keeper on 19 October 1891 and was removed on 22 December 1893.

John H. Long was appointed Keeper on 27 December 1893 and resigned on 11 April 1904.

John S. Pruitt was appointed Keeper on 7 April 1904 and was still serving in 1915.

John Hudson was listed as Keeper in 1917.

CBM (L) T. T. Moore was listed as the OIC in 1929.
