Located in Jonesport, Maine, the station was noted as of 2010 as a "CENTER POST OF THE COMMUNITY AND STAFFED WITH 28 ENLISTED PEOPLE. ASSETS INCLUDE A 47 FT MOTOR LIFE BOAT, 27- FOOT UTILITY BOAT,

AND A 25 FOOT RESPONSE BOAT. THE STATION ALSO HOSTS USCGC MORAY, AN 87 FT COASTAL PATROL BOAT WITH A CREW OF 10. ALSO ATTACHED ARE MAINE STATE MARINE PATROL BOATS AND SMALL CREW. OUR PRIMARY MISSIONS ARE SEARCH AND RESCUE, COMMERCIAL FISHING VESSEL SAFETY, AND FISHERIES LAW ENFORCEMENT.”
