



## Station Corson Inlet, New Jersey

USLSS Station #32, Fourth District  
Coast Guard Station #128

<b>Location:</b>	On Ludlam Beach, at Strathmere, New Jersey, 2-1/8 miles northeast by north of the Ludlam Beach Light and 7/8 mile southwest of Corson Inlet; 39° 12' 59" N x 74° 38' 06" W in 1878; 39° 13' 10" N x 74° 38' 20W in 1915
<b>Date of Conveyance:</b>	1855
<b>Station Built:</b>	1849
<b>Fate:</b>	Discontinued in 1964

### Remarks:

The original station built in 1855 was a 1855-Type station. That station was replaced in 1872 by a 1871 "Red House" type station.

### Keeper's & Officers in Charge:

Richard Stiles was appointed Keeper in 1856. It is not known when he left.

Sylvanus Corson was appointed Keeper on 17 January 1862 and was discharged on 3 November 1883.

Charles D. Stephens was appointed Keeper on 10 November 1883 and resigned on 23 October 1897.

Reuben S. Godfrey was appointed Keeper on 6 November

1897 and resigned for physical reasons on 2 February 1908.

Cornelius L. Nickerson was appointed Keeper on 29 January 1908 and was still service when the Life-Saving Service merged with the Revenue Cutter Service in 1915.

CBM (L) Edward Norton was OIC as of 1929.
