Cutter History:

Purchased by the Lighthouse Service in 1920 and placed into service in 1922 as a supply tender in the Third Lighthouse District. The vessel transferred to the Coast Guard, of which the Lighthouse Service was not yet a part, in 1924. She was reconditioned at the Depot at Curtis Bay, Maryland. She was sold for \$200 to Charles A. Jording in Baltimore, Maryland on 7 January 1927.
