Cutter History:

This motorboat was originally *Miss Anne II* and was known as SP-657 during World War I. She was used for communication cable work in the North Carolina sounds. Re-named *Lookout* on 16 December 1919 and *AB-7* on 6 November 1923, she was stationed at Charleston, SC after July 1924.
