An Indian tribe also known as the Fire Nation; they appear to have entered Wisconsin after 1600 under pressure from the Iroquois, and left or intermarried with other nations by about 1720.

Cutter History:

The *Mascoutin* was a 869-ton steam-powered tug that was acquired by the Coast Guard in 1921. She was commissioned on 17 December of that year and was based out of Norfolk, Virginia. She remained in service until 1936.
