Two – In 1918, twin sisters Genevieve and Lucille Baker of the Naval Coastal Defense Reserve became the first uniformed women to serve in the Coast Guard.

IN COAST GUARD HISTORY

2006 - CWO3 Mary Ward retired after serving as the Commanding Officer at Station Port Canaveral. CWO3 Ward was the first women warrant boatswain mate to command a CG Station.

2006 - CWO Apple G. Pryor was the first female African-American Naval Engineer Chief Warrant officer assigned to major cutter; she was Main Propulsion Assistant. She now serves on CGC BOUTWELL.

2006 - LT Isabel Papp was the first female medical officer and first Hispanic female MD to be assigned to a Port Security Unit. She currently serves in San Diego (Port Security Unit 311).



EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CASE STUDY!

CG received a final decision on a 2001 matter (appealed in 2004). An employee cited reprisal for past complaints as the basis for being twice passed over. Selection officials asserted that three candidates including the complainant were equally qualified. EEOC decided the record supported the complainant. **Lesson Learned:** Records must support that selections are based on merit.

GIVE YOUR TRAINING OPERATIONAL RELEVANCE



James Reason developed the “Swiss Cheese Model” to illustrate how, analyses of major accidents and catastrophic systems failures reveal multiple, smaller failures which lead to a hazard. In the model, each “slice” represents a safety barrier or precaution relevant to a hazard. At left, an example of failures which could lead to an equal opportunity incident.
