Who must comply?	Designers, manufacturers, and owners of vessels.
What is this collection about?	This collection pertains to the vital system automation on commercial vessels that is necessary to protect personnel and property on board U.S.-flag vessels.
Where do I find the requirements for this information?	Title 46 CFR 52, 56, 58, 62, 110, 111, and 113, is available at— http://ecfr.gpoaccess.gov , select TITLE 46 – SHIPPING, and follow to the respective part of the regulation.
When must information be submitted to the Coast Guard?	Information must be submitted to the Coast Guard (CG) prior to construction of the vessel.
How is the information submitted?	The information must be submitted in accordance with the regulations. Supplemental information for submitting information to the CG Marine Safety Center (MSC) is available at— https://homeport.uscg.mil/msc > select contact us>>Mail address.
What happens when complete information is received?	The vessel owner or builder may be assured that the vessel, if built in accordance with the plans, will meet the regulatory standards.
