How is the information submitted?	The information is submitted via http://Homeport.uscg.mil using form CG-718A found at (website) to the Local MTS Recovery Unit.
What happens when complete information is received?	The MTS Recovery Unit uses the provided information to assist in developing a strategy for the re-introduction of vessels into a port or waterway.
