This sea service credit may not be used to satisfy any recency requirements or for licenses other than those listed above.

**ADVANCED METEOROLOGY** Any applicant who has successfully completed your 35-hour Advanced Meteorology course will satisfy the Advanced Meteorology training requirements for STCW certification as Master or Chief Mate on vessels of 500 or more gross tonnage (ITC).
