Required Training (Personnel Who Receives Training)

A	All Coast Guard units whose personnel use or are potentially exposed to hazardous materials in the workplace.
A1	HAZCOM - Personnel who use, are exposed to, or come in contact with benzene in their workplace duties.
A2	All personnel currently exposed or with the potential of being exposed to asbestos (emergency repair team) and their division officer and work center supervisors shall receive training prior to or at the time of their initial assignment and annually thereafter
A3	Lead abatement or inspectors or managers. Also adhere to individual State Requirements where CG unit is located.
A4	As part of HAZCOM for personnel who live or work in areas serviced by pesticides.
B	Recommended for workers/operators who display poor safe work practice or involved in a MISHAP.
C	Operators of powered industrial truck.
D	Designated unit pesticide applicator.
E	POOL MANAGERS - Individuals shall be qualified in pool and filter operation and sanitation as provided by the state health department or similar agency. Upon the completion of any swimming pool, the manager and his operators shall be given complete written and oral instructions by the builder as well as operational guidance of the pool and all of the equipment and in the maintenance of the swimming pool water.
F	No specific training requirements for general workforce. Engineering generally provide training to personnel who manage or maintain the water/waste water system. Other personnel inspecting are PMT, HS.
G1	The employer shall provide training to ensure that the purpose and function of the energy control program are understood by employees and that the knowledge and skills required for the safe application, usage, and removal of the energy controls are acquired by employees.
G2	Personnel who face a risk of electric shock that is not reduced to a safe level by the electrical installation requirements of 1910.303 through 1910.308.
H	Training given only when requested or needed or if a designated fire brigade is present as stipulated in COMDTINST.
I	COMDTINST strongly encourages training. Refresher training for motorcyclist also strongly encourage.
J	Initial training required for Safety Supervisors. Aviation - Conduct annual training for the unit's Permanent Mishap Board member. Recommended only to provide instructions provided on proper MISHAP reporting to supervisors, employers, managers, and shop leaders.
K	All personnel exposed to hazardous noise shall receive a minimum of one hour of initial Hearing Conservation Training and appropriate refresher training annually thereafter.
L	All operational personnel at awareness level; first responders at operations level; COMDTINST 6160.31A provides matrix of requirements
M	Personnel potentially exposed initially to infectious medical waste.
M1	Initial training with annual updates for personnel who are at risk for blood borne pathogen exposure, activities that place them at-risk, and means to prevent disease transmission Law Enforcement, Vessel personnel, SAR personnel (aviation, shore based, or vessel), EMS, HS, or personnel involved in direct alien interdiction.
N	Respirator users shall be trained in the proper use and limitations of respirators. Training shall be repeated on a annual basis.
O	Employees involved in entry into confined spaces.
P	Life Guards, HS, EMS, medical personnel.
P1	Life Guards.
Q	Technician Certification program who perform maintenance, repair, or disposal.
R	Designed for Galley managers, food handlers, or designated by managers to receive training. Conduct effective and continuous training and prevention programs to temporary or permanent Food service personnel.
S	MLC(K) will provide training and assistance to clinic personnel and OMSEP Coordinator
T	Provided to personnel who are working within hazardous thermal stress environments or spaces.
U	Designated unit hazardous waste coordinators
