Personnel are required to demonstrate proficiency in all performance qualifications for higher pay grades. As proficiency in each performance qualification is demonstrated by actually performing the task listed, the DATE and INITIALS column shall be completed. Some enlisted performance qualifications include Supervisory Guidelines (SupGuide), which will assist in clarifying the intent and proper execution of the task that is to be performed. Personnel are reminded that, although demonstration of proficiency in new performance qualifications at or below their current pay grade is not required, they will be held responsible for those qualifications in future Service Wide Examinations. It is the member's responsibility to be proficient in all currently published performance qualifications, up to and including those of their present pay grade, for their specific rating.
