Lieutenant Commander, United States Coast Guard

Lieutenant Commander (LCDR) Fritz Kuebler, a native of Kansas City, Missouri graduated from the United States Coast Guard Academy in 1997 with Bachelor of Science Degree in Management.

Upon commissioning, he served as a Deck Watch Officer aboard USCGC TAMPA (WMEC 902) homeported in Portsmouth, VA. He subsequently served as Officer-in-Charge LEDET (Law Enforcement Detachment) 401, TACLET (Tactical Law Enforcement Team) South, in Miami, FL. After a tour of duty as a Command Duty Officer & Search and Rescue/Law Enforcement Controller at the Coast Guard Seventh District Command Center he assumed the duties of Operations Officer aboard USCGC CAMPBELL (WMEC 909) homeported in Kittery, ME. Upon completion of his Operations Officer tour, Lieutenant Commander Kuebler assumed command of USCGC JEFFERSON ISLAND (WPB 1340), homeported in Portland, ME.

Upon departure from JEFFERSON ISLAND, LCDR Kuebler was selected to attend Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs, Princeton, NJ. He was subsequently awarded a Masters of Public Policy in June 2008.

After Princeton, LCDR Kuebler reported to Coast Guard Headquarters in Washington, DC and worked in the Office of Planning and Performance (CG-81) where he spearheaded several savings initiatives including conversion of over 300 full time positions from contract to government work performance.

LCDR Kuebler's military awards include two Coast Guard Commendation Medals and two Coast Guard Achievement Medals, as well as other personal and service awards.
