

UNIFORM POLICY

Underway

The underway uniform shall meet the following criteria:

- (1) ODUs: The Operational Dress Uniform is the authorized uniform aboard MOHAWK at all times. While underway, unless otherwise stipulated in the Plan of the Day, the ODU blouse may be relaxed and the blue US Coast Guard embroidered tee shirt may be worn. Steel-toed boots must be worn with ODUs.
- (2) Coveralls: Coveralls must be of the same fabric and color of the ODU trousers, and must be free of tears and obvious spots. Law Enforcement coveralls with "USCG" printed on the back are authorized. A V-neck white T-shirt or the standard blue U.S. Coast Guard T-shirt must be worn under the coveralls. The coveralls may be adorned with the National Ensign patch on the left shoulder and the Coast Guard Ensign patch on the right shoulder. Steel-toed boots will be worn with coveralls.
- (3) Shirts: The standard blue T-shirt with white 1 inch embroidered U.S. Coast Guard lettering on the left chest area is the only authorized undershirt for ODUs.
- (4) Shoes: Black steel-toed boots shall be worn at all times while in ODUs or Coveralls. At no time aboard ship may core-frams be worn. Standard black Oxford shoes are authorized for use with Tropical Blue or Service Dress Blue uniforms.
- (5) Cold Weather Gear: The Foul Weather Parka is permitted in inclement weather and in air-conditioned areas like Combat and Radio. At no time shall the Foul Weather Parka Fleece be worn as a stand-alone uniform item.
- (6) Exercise: Appropriate civilian work-out clothing is permitted. Shirts shall be worn at all times while exercising.
- (7) Swim Call/Steel Beach: The appropriate outfit for swim call and steel beach is board shorts for males and one-piece swimsuits for females. At no time will speedos, bikinis, or other revealing attire be permitted.

Inport

The inport uniform shall follow the above guidelines with the following

exception:

(1) The ODU blouse shall be worn at all times unless member is on a working party, doing strenuous activity, or is working in an area of high temperatures.
