



## CG-IMAT FIRST YEAR EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

The Coast Guard Incident Management Assistance Team (CG-IMAT) provides National Incident Management System (NIMS) Incident Command System (ICS) trained, qualified and experienced personnel to deploy and assist Coast Guard Incident Commanders to protect against, respond to, recover from and mitigate the effects of all-hazard incidents and events to reduce the loss of life, property, and impact to the environment.

The CG-IMAT is responsible for providing support during all-hazard incidents for Incident Commanders, assisting in national and regional large-scale exercises with NIMS ICS oversight, support, coaching and training as requested, and providing participation and assistance as ICS instructors and subject matter experts when the CG-IMAT is not deployed.

During the first year of the CG-IMATs existence, the unit was employed for 3,651 days conducting activities in the Response, Readiness, Preparedness and Outreach mission areas.

The CG-IMAT Readiness mission area includes the training, qualification, and certification of each member and the team, following the guidelines in the CG-IMAT Concept of Operations, Standard Operating Procedures, and Incident Command System Doctrine.

2,106 Days

Individual Readiness, 1,256 days

- On August 1st, 2013: 19 of the 34 personnel assigned held 56 qualifications, and 1 position was vacant.
- On July 31st, 2014: 26 of the 30 personnel assigned held 92 ICS qualifications, and 3 positions were vacant.
- Team members completed 986 days for resident and non resident training.
- Team members completed 270 days of independent study training.

The CG-IMAT Response mission area is our primary customer service. This category captures the number of days that the CG-IMAT supported Coast Guard Operational Commanders and Other Government Agencies (OGAs) in managing disasters and National Special Security Events (NSSEs). In addition this category captures the number of days that the CG-IMAT was employed, shadowing OGAs during responses.

601 Days

The CG-IMAT responded to the following six events

- State of the Union Address, Sector Baltimore, January 2014
- UTV Hannah Settoon Spill Response, Sector New Orleans, February 2014
- Texas City "Y" Spill Response, Sector Houston/Galveston, Sector Corpus Christi, March-April 2014
- Unaccompanied Alien Children Influx 2014, CBP McAllen, Texas, May-August

The CG-IMAT Preparedness mission consists of the services that the CG-IMAT provides to Coast Guard Operational Commanders through CG-IMAT participation as subject matter experts, evaluators, coaches, instructors and verifying officers.

791 Days

- Trained approximately 1,500 Coast Guard personnel through individual/team training plans, exercises, workshops, ICS course instruction and on the job training at responses.
- Completed 9 ICS Workshops for Sector IMTs, using 130 days.
- Completed 19 Regional Specialist Visits, using 88 days.
- Supported 30 exercises, using 288 days.
- Supported 39 ICS Courses, using 285 days.
