




COAST GUARD IMAT ICS WORKSHOPS

The Coast Guard Incident Management Assist Team (CG-IMAT) provides National Incident Management System (NIMS) ICS trained, qualified and experienced personnel to deploy and assist Coast Guard Incident Commanders to protect against, respond to, recover from and mitigate the effects of all-hazard incidents and events to reduce the loss of life, property, and impact to the environment.

The CG-IMAT provides ICS Workshops to Coast Guard Sector and District Commanders on a regular basis. The purpose of the CG-IMAT ICS Workshop is to provide the opportunity for personnel assigned to ICS WQSBs and IMTs to execute the ICS Planning Process. Using an Incident Command Post style exercise, the CG-IMAT will coach members through each step of the Planning "P" process, with the goal of producing an Incident Action Plan. This workshop is the practical application of skills learned in a classroom setting, and may allow for tasks to be completed in pursuit of members' ICS qualification goals.

The CG-IMAT is:

- An asset available to support both PAC and LANT area units
- An all-hazards Incident Management Assist Team, for both planned and unplanned events
- Interoperable with other response assets
- Able to assist in exercise planning and development
- Able to assist in exercise evaluations and support
- Able to provide ICS training and coaching
- Able to provide support to both resident and exportable training

ICS WORKSHOP REQUEST PROCESS

Ideally, the request for a CG-IMAT ICS Workshop will be in support of a unit;s scheduled exercise and can be requested via the Contingency Planning System and MTEP (Multi-year Training and Exercise Plan)

Non MTEP Request Process

- 90 Days - Request workshop date: contact your CG-IMAT Regional Specialist

- CG-IMAT and the unit will discuss and agree upon dates and location

- Discuss roles and responsibilities of both parties

-Requesting unit engages with their District to discuss RFF needs

- 60 days - Unit will receive an email with logistical and support needed from requesting unit

- 30 days - Conference call to discuss scenario, venue and controllers

- 15 days - Conference call to finalize ICS 201 form for STARTEX
