Facts & Numbers

- Atlantic Area includes over 14 million square miles of land encompassing 40 states, and over 4 million square miles of navigable water - everything east of the Rocky Mountains to the Arabian Gulf, from Canada to the Caribbean Sea.
 - Coordinates with five geographical combatant commanders; NORTHCOM, SOUTHCOM, CENTCOM, EUCOM, AFRICOM, and one functional Combatant Commander TRANSCOM.
 - Nearly 26,000 active duty and reserve forces are located in Atlantic Area.

On Land...

Maritime Intelligence Fusion Center Atlantic (MIFC LANT)

- Located in Virginia Beach, VA., MIFC LANT serves as Atlantic Area's tactical maritime intelligence nexus, leveraging all available information sources and methods to provide time-critical, actionable intelligence to LANT operational commanders across the full range of Coast Guard missions.

Redeployment Assistance and Inspection Detachment (RAID)

- RAID is based out of Portsmouth, VA. The team deploys to combat zones in Iraq and Afghanistan, embedding with various DoD units in order to support the safe redeployment of military containers, personnel gear and rolling stock. RAID's efforts help the military logistics system run more efficiently.

Communication Area Master Station Atlantic (CAMSLANT)

- CAMSLANT, located in Chesapeake, VA., along with Communications Stations Boston, Miami and New Orleans provide rapid, reliable, and secure communications support and services to Atlantic Area's operational commanders, mobile units, other government agencies, and the maritime community.

Navigation Center (NAVCEN)

- NAVCEN operates the Maritime Information Operation Center (MIOC), the state-of-the art center that provides 24/7 operational control, situational awareness and dissemination of information for critical Maritime Domain Awareness and key navigation systems.

Activities Europe (ACTEUR)

- ACTEUR, Rotterdam, The Netherlands, area of responsibility encompasses Europe, the Middle East and Africa. ACTEUR's staff includes 24 members who travel widely to conduct their Coast Guard missions in Commercial Vessel Compliance (Safety, Security and Environmental Protection), the International Port Security Program, Environmental Stewardship, and International Outreach and Engagement.

At Sea...

378-foot High Endurance Cutter (WHEC)

- CGC DALLAS and CGC GALLATIN, both located in Charleston, S.C., are Atlantic Area's high endurance cutters.
- Capable of supporting helicopter deployment, 378's were introduced to the Coast Guard inventory in the 1960s and are highly versatile in performing a variety of missions throughout the world's oceans.

270-foot Medium Endurance Cutter (WMEC)

- All 13 of the Coast Guard's Famous Cutter Class are located in Atlantic Area, in the ports of Kittery, ME.; Boston, MA.; Portsmouth, VA.; and Key West, FL.
- Capable of supporting helicopter deployment, 270's were introduced to the Coast Guard inventory between 1983-91 and are highly versatile in performing a variety of missions throughout the world's oceans.

210-foot Medium Endurance Cutter (WMEC)

- There are 14 total in the Reliance Cutter Class, 11 of which reside in ports throughout Atlantic Area, from Portsmouth, NH., to Galveston, TX.
- Capable of supporting helicopter deployment, 210's were introduced to the Coast Guard inventory between 1964-69. They conduct homeland security, drug and alien migrant interdiction, and search and rescue operations.

CGC EAGLE - 295-foot three-masted sailing Barque

- Homeported at the Coast Guard Academy, New London, CT., CGC EAGLE is the only active (operational) commissioned sailing vessel in the U.S. maritime services.

Patrol Forces Southwest Asia

- Six 110-foot Island Class cutters and 245 personnel comprise this force based in Manama, Bahrain. Operating as part of Navy Central Command, they provide force protection for U.S. vessels and Iraqi oil platforms vital to the rebuilding of that country.
