In 1953, the World Meteorological Organization began naming tropical storms with women's names. In 1979, men's names were added to the list. Each list of names is reused every six years.

The Greek alphabet was introduced for the first time during the 2005 hurricane season once the original name list was used.

Names of major storms that make landfall and cause catastrophic damage are retired (Andrew, Camille, Katrina, etc.).

HOW TO USE THIS TRACKING CHART

Watch the 13NEWS WEATHER LAB Team for up-to-the-minute storm positions, given in latitude and longitude. Lines of Latitude run horizontally and are used to find north/south, or vertical positions on your tracking map. Lines of Longitude run vertically and are used to find the east/west or horizontal position on your tracking map.
