Master Chief Goodhue assumed his duties as the first Command Master Chief for Personnel Service Center on 01 June 2009. A 1973 graduate of Fairhaven High School in MA, he is a Health Services Technician by trade. He advanced to Chief Petty Officer in January 1993 and advanced to Master Chief in January 2002.

A native of Fairhaven, Massachusetts, Master Chief Goodhue enlisted in the U. S. Coast Guard in September 1979. He attended both the Hospital Corpsman "A" School in 1980 located at the U. S. Coast Guard Academy, New London, CT and Dental Technician "C" School located at U. S. Coast Guard TRACEN Cape May, Cape May NJ in 1984. Master Chief Goodhue also attended the U. S. Army Medical Equipment and Optical School at Fitzsimons Army Medical Center in Aurora CO in 1982.

Master Chief Goodhue's last assignment was the clinic supervisor for the Coast Guard's largest healthcare facility at U. S. Coast Guard TRACEN Cape May Health Services Division from June 2007 to May 2009. He also served in several U. S. Coast Guard clinics: U. S. Coast Guard Air Station Borinquen, U. S. Coast Guard Support Center New York, U. S. Coast Guard ISC Boston and independently aboard two cutters, Coast Guard Cutter CAMPBELL (WMEC 909) from 1991 to 1994 and Coast Guard Cutter POLAR STAR (WAGB 10) from 1996 to 1998. He has had three staff tours at US Coast Guard Headquarters with his last tour as the Health Services Rating Force Master Chief from June 2002 to June 2007.

Master Chief Goodhue holds an Associate of Science degree in Biomedical Equipment/Electronics Repair from Regis University, Denver CO. He is also a graduate of the U. S. Navy Senior Enlisted Academy, Class 106 (KHAKI).

Master Chief Goodhue's personal awards include: the Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medal, four Coast Guard Commendation Medals (with "O" Device), three Coast Guard Achievement Medals (with "O" Device), ten Coast Guard Good Conduct awards, the Antarctic Service Medal, and has earned the permanent Coast Guard Cutterman's Insignia along with other numerous unit and team awards.
