Command Master Chief Jason Vanderhaden serves as the senior enlisted advisor to the 13th Coast Guard District Commander. In this capacity he advises the District Commander who is responsible for U.S. Coast Guard operations covering 4 states, more than 4,400 miles of coastline, 600 miles of inland waterways, and a 125 nautical mile international border with Canada.

Command Master Chief Vanderhaden is a native of Tallahassee, FL and enlisted in the Coast Guard in May 1988. His assignments include two small boat stations, three cutters, two air stations, LORAN Station, and instructor at the Chief Petty Officer Academy. He previously served as the Command Master Chief USCG BSU Honolulu.

Command Master Chief Vanderhaden is a graduate of the Coast Guard Chief Petty Officer Academy, Coast Guard Senior Enlisted Leadership Course, Coast Guard Command Master Chief Course, and the KEYSTONE senior enlisted leader course.

Command Master Chief Vanderhaden's military awards include three Coast Guard Commendation Medals with "O" device, four Coast Guard Achievement Medals with "O" device, Commandant's letter of Commendation, five Coast Guard Unit Commendations with "O" device, four Coast Guard Meritorious Unit Commendations "O" device, three Coast Guard Battle "E" ribbons, six Good Conduct awards, Expert Rifle, and Expert Pistol.
