Port Security Information Bulletin
PSIB 04-04

Maritime Security Condition (MARSEC) 2 Unchanged
January 5, 2004

The purpose of this PSIB is to remind port stakeholders that the ports of Houston, Galveston, Texas City, and Freeport remain in MARSEC 2. Facilities and vessels are further reminded that they must contact MSO Houston-Galveston, (713) 671-5133, or MSU Galveston, (409) 682-1264 when MARSEC 2 condition levels have been achieved.

This shift occurred in accordance with direction from the Secretary of Homeland Security to raise the Homeland Security Advisory level from Yellow (Elevated) to Orange (High) December 21, 2003.

As indicated in PSIB 30-03, Change in Homeland Security Advisory Level, the Coast Guard has no specific maritime threat information regarding the Houston-Galveston port areas. Should the Coast Guard receive specific threat information involving the Houston-Galveston area, it will be conveyed through the appropriate communications channels and released as soon as possible in accordance with federal security regulations.

Local Coast Guard commands will continue to coordinate with local, state, and federal government agencies, as well as the maritime community to ensure that all stakeholders in the Ports of Houston, Galveston, Freeport and Texas City are maintaining a heightened state of vigilance and readiness.
