USCGC Morgenthau was commissioned on March 10, 1969. Originally homeported at Governors Island, New York, Morgenthau was moved to Alameda, CA in 1977. In January 2013 Morgenthau made another move and Honolulu, HI became the new homeport. CGC Morgenthau was named after the 52nd U.S. Secretary of the Treasury, Henry Morgenthau Jr. The ship's original motto was "Efficiency and Honor is Our Destiny." After the move to California, the motto was changed to "Decus Pacifici," which in English translates to "Pride of the Pacific."


