Captain Marshall was born in Frankfort, Indiana. He is a graduate of Miami University, Oxford, Ohio and Asbury Seminary, Lexington, Kentucky. He is ordained by the Wesleyan Church whose historical roots are Methodist. He pastored for three years before being assigned to his Denomination's Headquarters where he was responsible for Religious Education Curriculum and Family and Marriage Enrichment Programs.

Chaplain Marshall joined the Navy Chaplain Corps in October of 1984. He has served with the Navy, Marine Corps and U.S. Coast Guard. His assignments with Navy include: Naval Air Station Keflavik, Iceland; Chaplains Religious Enrichment Development Operation (CREDO) Great Lakes Naval Training Center, Illinois; USS TEXAS (CGN39); USS CALIFORNIA (CGN 36); Puget Sound Naval Shipyard; USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN (CVN 72) deploying for over ten months in support of Operations Southern Watch, Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom; and Naval Support Activity Bahrain. His most recent Navy assignment was to Commander Navy Region Europe, Africa, Southwest Asia, located in Naples, Italy, from October 2008 to October 2011.

His assignment with the U.S. Marine Corps was to the Second Marine Division, Fleet Marine Force, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina and included tours with 2D Tank Battalion and Battalion 2/8 deploying to the Mediterranean with Battalion Landing Team 2/8 on Board USS BARNSTABLE COUNTY (LST 1197).

Chaplain Marshall's assignments with the Coast Guard include District 13, Seattle, Washington and ATLANTIC AREA/FIFTH DISTRICT (LANT AREA), Portsmouth, Virginia. During his LANT AREA tour he responded to and successfully led 29 chaplains in a seven week response to Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. He reported to his PACIFIC AREA assignment 28 November 2011.

Captain Marshall is a recipient of various service medals and unit citations.

Chaplain Marshall is married to the former Lois A. Baumann and they have three children and nine grandchildren.
