Captain **William J. Rall** is the division chief for the Force Readiness Command Reserve Force Readiness Division (FC-1), assuming his current position in June, 2009. FC-1 is a robust reserve force cadre that will insure the readiness of the reserve force through training, qualifications, doctrine, standardization and compliance as appropriate to reserves, and insure that reservists, to the fullest extent possible, have the same skill sets as active duty guardians.

In his previous post, he served as the Chief of Personnel for the Coast Guard's Maintenance and Logistics Command in Alameda, California, where he was responsible for the personnel administrative programs, force optimization and training, and housing for the entire Pacific Theater. During a versatile career, Captain Rall has served in both afloat and ashore tours of duty that have included serving as an instructor at the Coast Guard Academy, the Coast Guard Liaison Officer to the Joint Intelligence Center Pacific at the Naval Base Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, the Executive Officer on board cutter HEALY and as the chief of operational intelligence at the Pacific Area Intelligence and Maritime Intelligence Fusion Center (MIFC) in Alameda.

The U.S. Coast Guard Academy graduate earned Masters of Science degree from the Naval Post Graduate School in Monterey, California. Captain Rall has also completed the requirements and testing for his Merchant Marine license, and earned his Master unlimited, all oceans license.
