- Reserve PCS MUST be processed in DA. Typical tour length for enlisted reservist is five years. E6 and below do NOT have to transfer unless there is a service need or they want to PCS – then they need to submit an e-resume. No Tono / Acctg data for Reserve PCS and the losing unit does the orders. PSU's are the exception – members that live within a reasonable commuting distance should expect to be rotated into a PSU position at some time in their reserve career.
- Reservists have to communicate they WANT to transfer. Submit an e-resume and then contact RPM because they do not know if an e-resume has been submitted unless they are notified.
- Q: Is there a priority for reserves that do a PCS from a PSU?
A: There is no set priority list, however, they try to do the best they can to put them where they desire. E-6 and below assigned to a PSU are the only ones required to transfer.
- Q: How many reservists PCS each year?
A: 300-400.
- Q: Can a reservist fleet-up?
A: Yes.
- Q: Are there any messages reminding reservists coming off Long Term ADOS about their orders?
A: When reservists RELAD, they should be contacting their Assignment Officers for a billet. Sometimes they get placed in IRR and we would rather NOT do that, so call RPM3 first to inquire about a billet. Regular Active Duty RELAD's go through the ISTT for reserve position placement.
- Q: Can a command request specific members for ADOS?
A: Yes, as long as they're qualified.
- Q: Will reserve billets be cut like active duty billets?
A: No. There are 7,900 reservists and we are authorized to have 10,000.
Cutting billets = giving back money
- Q: Does the new 55% per diem policy for ADOS orders apply to Title 10 orders?
A: Only voluntary Title 10.

- Q: Why was the per diem reduced to 55%? Won't that mean higher turnover?
A: It was reduced to save money and it just means that members will have to live within their means.
