TRICARE Suspicious Calls



15 September 2010

(U) Background: Recently there has been a rash of calls to military personnel from individuals (NFI) who claimed to be with DoD and requested information under the guise of it being a TRICARE national survey.

(U) Synopsis: On 15 Sep 10, an active duty Hurlburt Field (HFLD) Airmen was contacted about a TRICARE survey. The member was asked for personal information such as: Social Security Number, home address, Date of Birth. Additionally, the caller asked about deployment status and length of deployments. When the Airmen asked why personal information TRICARE already had on file was being asked, the caller immediately hung up. The Airmen attempted to call the number back, but no one answered. The member saved the phone number (312) 258-4260. An online phone look up was conducted the number originates from Chicago, Illinois area. Using who-callsme.com showed there is a blog about the above number and calling others around the United States. The Investigations section called the above number and an answering machine picked-up and spoke about a TRICARE survey. The national and local TRICARE offices were contacted and verified they do conduct surveys; however, they never request the above type personal information. If you receive a call from anyone about a TRICARE and believe it to be false contact your local TRICARE office (HFLD 881-2620). Investigations Comments: If you receive a call that requests personal information do not disclose it. Ask the caller basic type questions to help ensure you determine if the call is legitimate i.e. a call back number, their name and employee number, the name of the company needing the information, and why they need your personal information. **Remember your personal information is yours and you need to protect it.**

TRICARE NEWS

Eligibility for the TRICARE Retiree Dental Program includes “gray area” retirees, surviving family members and retirees living overseas

The government-authorized TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) began in 1998 as a voluntary option that offered basic dental benefits to Uniformed Services retirees and their eligible family members. In 2000—some three years before the first TRDP contract would expire—the TRDP scope of benefits was enhanced to include such comprehensive services as crowns, bridges, full and partial dentures, and orthodontics. In 2003, the second five-year TRDP contract was awarded by the Department of Defense to the incumbent administrator, Delta Dental of California, and included further improvements such as a shorter enrollment commitment and waiting period, increased maximums, and an expanded dentist network.

The TRDP is now in its third year of operations under a new five-year contract that began October 1, 2008 and today provides affordable, comprehensive dental benefits—including dental implant services, coverage for posterior composite fillings, and a \$1,500 lifetime orthodontic maximum—to over 1.2 million covered lives.

Also starting October 1 of 2008, TRDP benefits under the new Enhanced-Overseas Program were expanded to retirees and their eligible family members who reside overseas. Until then, overseas enrollees had to return to the Enhanced TRDP service area to receive dental care. Additionally, the new contract included a provision that now allows Enhanced Program enrollees who live within the service area to be covered for emergency treatment when they are traveling outside the service area.

There are still a large number of eligible individuals—including retirees living overseas, unmarried surviving spouses and children, and “gray-area” retired Reservists and National Guard members—who are unaware of the TRDP or even that they are indeed eligible. Outreach efforts by Delta Dental to promote awareness about the TRDP continue to expand to ensure that as much of the eligible population as possible is informed of the benefits this affordable group program has to offer.

The TRDP service area includes all 50 states as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Canada. Enrollees may seek care from any licensed dentist in this service area or can maximize their benefit savings by choosing a dentist from an expansive participating TRDP network.

After a mandatory 12-month enrollment obligation is satisfied, enrollees can remain in the program on a month-to-month basis. The Basic Program was closed to new enrollees in 2000 but continues with no change in benefits for those already enrolled and who wish to remain enrolled.

The TRDP carries a \$50-per-person-per-year deductible with a family cap of \$150 and an annual maximum of \$1,200 per person (\$1,000 for Basic Program enrollees) against which preventive and diagnostic services are not counted. Coverage for these services as well as for basic restorative services, periodontic services, endodontic services, oral surgery and dental emergencies is available immediately upon the effective date of coverage.

Major services such as crowns, bridges, full and partial dentures, implants and orthodontics, payable at 50 percent, are available to Enhanced TRDP enrollees after a 12-month waiting period. A waiver of this waiting period may be granted to certain individuals who enroll in the TRDP within four months after their retirement and provide supporting documentation.

NOAA Scientists Receive Presidential Honor

November 8, 2010

Three NOAA scientists will receive the 2009 Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers (PECASE). The award is the highest honor bestowed by the U.S. government on outstanding scientists and engineers in the early stages of their careers.

"It is very gratifying that NOAA scientists are honored early in their careers by this significant award," said Jane Lubchenco, Ph.D., under secretary of commerce for oceans and atmosphere and NOAA administrator. "We are immensely proud of these three individuals. They represent the best of NOAA science. While they are being lauded for specific work, this award also recognizes the promise of future contributions to science and the nation."

Recipients are: J. Christopher Taylor, an ecologist at the National Center for Coastal Ocean Science's Center for Coastal Fisheries and Habitat Research in Beaufort, N.C.; Matthew Menne, a physical scientist at the National Climatic Data Center in Asheville, N.C.; and Charles Stock, an oceanographer at the Geophysical Fluid Dynamics Laboratory in Princeton, N.J.

Taylor was nominated for leading research in the development and use of new underwater sonar technologies that make coastal ecosystem assessments more efficient, safe and cost effective.

Menne was nominated for using innovative methods to develop high-quality climate data sets, including identifying and correcting inaccuracies in U.S. temperature records.

Stock's contributions included the use of computer models to better understand a range of climate and ecosystem dynamics, such as predicting harmful algal blooms and how food webs vary from region to region.

A date has not yet been set for the award ceremony in Washington, D.C.

VA Lists Navy Ships that Qualify for Presumptive Agent Orange Exposure 6/10 – The Department of Veterans Affairs Compensation and Pension Service has issued 2 lists of naval vessels it has verified conducted operations on the inland “brown water” rivers and delta areas of Vietnam. The lists also identify certain vessel types that operated primarily on the inland waterways. If a veteran’s service aboard one of these ships can be confirmed through military records during the time frames specified, then exposure to herbicide agents (e.g., Agent Orange) can be presumed. The lists include all vessels of Inshore Fire Support (IFS) Division 93; all vessels with the designation LST, LCVP, PCF (“Swift Boats”), and PBR during their entire Vietnam tour; all Coast Guard WPBs and WHECs during their Vietnam tours. VA Adds Ships to Agent Orange Exposure List

This week the VA has added the below named ships to the already existing list for Navy and Coast Guard ships and vessels that are presumed to have been exposed to Agent Orange. If you served on any of these mentioned ships and you have had a claim denied, you should reapply citing the VA list as the source for your reapplication. NAUS is told the VA is already working on a third list that will have more ships listed. If you have a claim and evidence the ship you served on was in Vietnamese waters and/or actually tied up to a dock there, make sure you include that with your claim.

VA Launching New Personalized Veterans Health Benefits Handbook

November 18, 2010

WASHINGTON – The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is piloting new, personalized Veterans Health Benefits Handbooks. The handbooks are tailored to provide enrolled Veterans with the most relevant health benefits information based on their own specific eligibility. In essence, each handbook will be written for the individual Veteran. “These handbooks will give Veterans everything they need to know and leave out everything that doesn’t apply to them,” said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki. “Our Veterans will now have a comprehensive, easy to understand roadmap to the medical benefits they earned with their service.”

In addition to highlighting each Veteran’s specific health benefits, the handbook also provides contact information for the Veteran’s preferred local facility, ways to schedule personal appointments, guidelines for communicating treatment needs and an explanation of the Veteran’s responsibilities, such as copayments when applicable.

“Enhancing access isn’t just about expanding the kinds of services VA provides. It also includes making sure we do everything we can to ensure Veterans have a clear understanding of the benefits available to them so they can make full use of the services they have earned,” Shinseki said.

The new handbooks will initially be available only to certain Veterans in Cleveland and Washington, D.C., areas. Following the pilot phase, full implementation is scheduled to begin in the fall of 2011 for across the country.



Editor's notes**KEEPING RETIREE & ANNUNITANT SERVICES INFORMED**

All retirees are reminded to inform PPC (RAS) as soon as possible following changes of marital status (divorce, death, annulment, marriage, just to mention some), death of a designated SBP beneficiary, or any other changes which could impact retired pay. Additionally, when you make a change with DEERS it **does not** constitute a change to your Retired Pay account since DEERS is a totally different system from RAS.

STATE TAX REMINDER: As a reminder when moving from one state to another and updating your home mailing address, don't forget to change your state tax withholdings. The retiree must request a change for state tax as an address change does not automatically change or stop the state information that the tax is being paid to.

More DD-214 information

Great news for veterans—the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) has provided the following website for veterans to gain access to their DD-214 online: <http://vetrecs.archives.gov/>. This will cut the waiting time veterans have had in the past waiting for copies of their DD-214s. **Note:** This website does not allow you to see or print a copy of your DD-214 but does allow you to print the request form needed to mail or fax to NPRC for obtaining a copy of your DD-214.

VA compensation payments and federal income taxes

If you retired from the USCG or NOAA based on years of service and are later given a retroactive service connected disability rating by the VA, your retirement pay for the retroactive period is excluded from income up to the amount of VA disability benefits that you would have been entitled to receive. The form 1099R reports the entire distribution because the income, when paid, was taxable under the law.

A corrected form 1099R which could support the decrease in taxable income will not be issued by PPC. This policy is contained in the DOD Financial Management Regulations, VOL 7B and also is stated in the IRS instructions for form 1099R, which directs that the entire income distribution will be reported if a part is taxable and a part is not taxable.

Retirees who are affected by this policy should consult a tax preparer for assistance. The retiree should provide copies of the Form 1099R and the VA Award Letter to claim a refund of taxes paid on the excludable amount.

You may also claim a refund of any taxes paid on an excludable amount in previous years by filing an amended return on Form 1040X, subject to Statute of Limitations.

Income Tax Withholding Changes

If you need to:

- ◆ Start or change the amount of State Tax Withholding (Retirees can call, e-mail, fax or use *IRS Form W-4, or state form. **If using IRS form, indicate that the form is for State Income Tax Withholding, not federal, which state it's for and the dollar amount to be withheld, (minimum amount is \$10.00, no cents).** We cannot withhold state tax for annuitants
