SAPS are frequently called upon to represent the program before Coast Guard personnel and on occasion other services and the public. These persons should acquire the interpersonal skills needed to communicate with small and large groups. The ability to develop classroom instruction materials, prepare for public speaking engagements, and ensure the quality of locally obtained training is essential. Incumbents travel frequently including occasional foreign travel. Their willingness and stamina to do so is critical.

Responsibilities: Establish a network of unit CDARs and consistently provide updated and new information pertaining to CDAR issues. Conduct and assist other commands' CDARs in developing and conducting general alcohol awareness and SAFE awareness training programs. Advise and assist units in respective areas on all matters pertaining to substance abuse prevention and treatment
