

Subj: PRECEPT CONVENING A BOARD TO CONSIDER COMMISSIONED OFFICERS
OF THE COAST GUARD RESERVE FOR PERMANENT RESERVE PROGRAM
ADMINISTRATOR (RPA) DESIGNATION

Ref: (a) Personnel Manual, COMDTINST M1000.6A

1. Pursuant to the authority provided by Article 1.B.3 of reference (a), an RPA Permanent Designation Board is appointed consisting of yourself as President and the following members:

CAPT Andrea M. Marcille, USCG – Member
CAPT Robert A. Stohlman, USCGR - Member
CAPT Andrew G. Liske, USCGR - Member
CAPT Phillip I. Brookings, USCGR – Member
CAPT Ronald A. Labrec, USCG, - Member

LCDR Paul M. Lalicata, USCG – Non-voting recorder

2. The Board will convene at 0830, 4 October 2011, in suite 501, Coast Guard Personnel Service Center, or as soon thereafter as practicable, for the purpose of selecting on a fully qualified basis, all eligible applicants for designation as permanent Reserve Program Administrators (RPAs). Members of the Board shall swear or affirm that they will, without prejudice or partiality, and having in view both the special fitness of officers and the efficiency of the Coast Guard, perform the duties imposed upon them.

3. The Board will consider officers serving as provisional RPAs who are eligible for designation as permanent RPAs. A listing of those officers will be provided. From this list, the Board may recommend all of the officers for designation as permanent RPAs. If the Board finds any of those officers not fully qualified for designation as permanent RPAs, the reasons therefore shall be set forth in detail.

4. Prior to the date the Board submits its report, the Commander, Coast Guard Personnel Service Center, is authorized to delete the name of any officer whose name is removed from the Active Duty Promotion List, Inactive Duty Promotion List, or RPA Promotion List for any reason. In the event any officer before the Board is removed prior to the date the Board submits

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its report, the Commander, Coast Guard Personnel Service Center, will provide additional instructions. Any communications to the Board by any officer under consideration will be transmitted under separate cover.

5. The Board shall refer to the provisions of Sections 5.A and 14.A of reference (a) and the enclosed Commandant's Guidance to PY12 Officer Selection Boards in your development of criteria for determining the officers recommended for designation. Section 14.A.3 of reference (a) provides four factors to consider in developing your criteria: performance, professionalism, leadership, and education.
6. You must emphasize to the members of the Board the importance of their obligation to confine themselves to facts of record and not predicate judgments on rumor or hearsay. At the end of your deliberations, all members must be able to say that the officers are, in the opinion of at least a majority of the members if the Board has less than five members, or in the opinion of at least two-thirds of the members if the Board has more than five members, the officers recommended for designation as permanent RPAs are fully qualified for designation as permanent RPAs to meet the needs of the service of those officers whose names have been furnished to the Board.
7. The Board shall submit a report in writing signed by all members of the Board. Except for the report of this Board, the proceedings of the Board shall not be disclosed to any person not a member of the Board. You will direct the members of the Board that their recommendations shall be kept confidential until the Secretary approves the report on behalf of the President, and the names of the officers selected for designation are released to the Service at large.
